Subject: Three FBI documents from the May meeting

The FBI's action, as described below in Kevin's e-mail, is in blatant and total disregard of the calendar set up under the JFK Act. I believe that there needs to be a written record of our dissatisfaction with the situation through a letter to the FBI Director and the President (and perhaps appropriate Congressional oversight committee chairs). For the record, notification of the Board's votes on the May documents was made to the FBI on May 29. The FBI's 30 day window expired on June 29, at which time the records should have been available. We sent the other May documents to the Archives on August 8th. On August 9th, Kevin was notified about the appeal. The Bureau has shown no respect for the law and should be called on it and we should be on record about it.
