Subject: Re: Slawson-Coleman report
The Slawson-Coleman report is a Warren Commission document, obviously, but one that was also published by the HSCA. Your e-mail correspondent is comparing the version that appeared in HSCA Vol. XI back in 1979 with the first cut the CIA did on the document in 1994 following passage of the JFK Act. The fact that the CIA redacted, in 1994, information published in 1979 can probably be ascribed to incompetence more than anything else. Regardless, my understanding from Bob is that the CIA team and the Board have processed this document recently and that the only postponements upheld were five instances where the name John Scelso was substituted for the true name of a certain CIA employee. This relatively unscathed version of the report will not make it out to NARA II for some time (check w/Bob and Tom for likely time-frame) but will, in any case, make your correspondent happy (or at least less unhappy... which is about as much as one can hope for). I trust this helps.
