Subject: record in both cia and fbi files
I believe that CIA record number 104-10005-10188 can be treated for reporting purposes as a duplicate of FBI record number 124-10169-10076, which the Review Board discussed and voted to release in full at this week's meeting. (The record in question is a September 1964 communication from FBI to CIA regarding Kostikov. CIA has told us that the only postponements remaining in 104-10005-10188 are solely FBI equities.) I think we should report both of these records as decided at this week's meeting. The FBI copy of this document has some information not contained in the CIA copy, so the number of releases to be reported for each number is different. The CIA record has one former postponement, plus three redactions opened by the Board, for a total of four releases (and no sustained postponements). It is possible (maybe even probable) that the FBI will appeal this record, so we will have to make a point of keeping CIA apprised of its status. Please let me know if you have any questions on this.
