Subject: USSS Material
I spoke with John Machado today at his office. He said that he did not think the Service would have any problem with material in the Record, which the Review Board will have an opportunity to examine at the November 13-14, 1996 meeting. John said that the Service allows researchers to look at Secret Service materials stored at the Archives; the Service keeps track of researchers who ask to see their records. Only material at the Federal Records Center is off limits to outside researchers. I will check with the Textual Reference section to find out what access has been granted to the Record (pre-1960). John said that he had been at the LBJ Library in January, 1996. I asked him what records were in the Secret Service box. John said that there were several boxes, and they contained mostly protective surveys. He said there may have been some Kennedy surveys, but most were for President Johnson. My thought is that these boxes might contain copies of shift reports and/or protective surveys for President Johnson's landing at Andrews Air Force Base on 11-22-63, which were destroyed in the Secret Service collection.
