here is my suggested media advisory on the Powers film for distribution on Tuesday afternoon, assuming all goes well and we are in a position to do that. When I did this on Wordperfect, I got it on one page with a top margin of 1.8 inches, 13 point font for "MEDIA ADVISORY" heading and 11 point font on the rest of the text. Please feel free to edit as you see fit. I tried to hit the key points, not playing it up to big, but giving enough info about what it is. Kennedy the day he was assassinated. Copies of the film will be made available to the media at the Review Board offices on Thursday, November 21, 1996 at 9:00 a.m. The three minute amateur film, taken by former presidential aide Dave Powers, chronicles President Kennedy's trip to Texas on November 21-22, 1963 and has never been seen publicly. It consists of a series of short sequences of the President and Mrs. Kennedy. The film does not show the assassination of the President. Powers, who was riding in a Secret Service car directly behind the presidential limousine during the Dallas motorcade, ran out of film minutes before the motorcade entered Dealey Plaza where the shots were fired that killed the President. The film will eventually become part of the JFK Collection at the National Archives, but is not available there yet. Videotape copies of the film are only being made available to the media by the Assassination Records Review Board at this time.
