	you will:PROPOSED DRAFT:Thank you very much for your thoughtful letter of December 26, 1996.We
	appreciate the information that you have provided concerning the location of records relating to the
	assassination of President Kennedy. Shortly before my meeting with you in November of last year, I visited
	Belarus with colleagues from the Review Board. The meeting was fruitful to the extent that we established a
	relationship, and we are hopeful that we will gain some access to the six volumes of records on Oswald that
	they maintain. Although the records under the control of the Belarusian KGB promise to be of great
	importance in understanding Lee Harvey Oswald's residence in the former USSR and the reaction of the Soviet
	authorities to his defection and ultimate return to the United States, they are not, we believe the only
	important assassination-related records to be found in the former USSR. The Assassination Records Review
	Board is interested in the broadest range of records. We believe that there are, for example, significant
	records that relate to the reaction of the Soviet government to the assassination. A careful review of
	appropriate archival holdings would yield, we believe, records that reflect the reaction of a variety of party
	and state organs to the event. Soviet foreign ministry records would likewise reveal the reactions of East Bloc
	nations. Our meetings in November with Igor Lebedev, Director of the Foreign Ministry Archives, and Vladimir
	Tiuneyev, Acting head of the State Archives Service have given us confidence that there are indeed other
	avenues worthy of pursuit. Although we will continue to seek the KGB records, we wish to ensure that all
	other sources of relevant records have been checked. To the extent that you can be helpful to us in this
