Jim Garrison was Novell's defense counsel. In that statement Novell supposedly named the shooters and their positions in Dealey Plaza. Stubbs offered to send us a copy, I will write to him and ask for the same.Stubbs also sent a copy of a Louisiana State Police Intelligence Division report about General Walker's activities in New Orleans on 11/21/63. The report also contained information about Jack Neuborh (one of Guy Banister's investigators) and Jack Martin (also a Banister investigator.) This copy came from the Hale Boggs papers at Tulane. Stubbs also sent a copy of a handwritten letter from one James L. Arthurs to then-Congressman F. Edward Hebert of Louisiana. The letter is a vitriolic attack on JFK and RFK. Interestingly, Arthurs used an address of 544 Camp Street, New Orleans. This copy came from the Tulane University Special Collections and Manuscript Division.
