Subject: news article on autopsy

I have just read the article from 1963, which offers speculation about the President's wounds, the type of bullet, and a possible ricochet of a bullet inside the limousine. It does seem to be just speculation. With regard to Ms. Cunningham's observation that Gochenaur's and Moore's testimony is not in the Archives, you can tell her that ARRB requested this testimony and is waiting for the Senate Intelligence Committee to provide it. When ARRB gets it, it will probably be declared an assassination record and go to the Archives. From the documents I've seen on this issue, Moore apparently denied all of Gochenaur's allegations about Moore's words and deeds, and the SSCI did not have any basis to go further with Moore or with Gochenaur--or with Dr. Perry. We will know whether there is more to pursue once we see what the SSCI has. I have not come across any report by the Secret Service indicating a threat from Mrs. Perry. As Ms. Cunningham probably already knows, the Secret Service Official Case File is not rified because it was placed in the Archives in 1979. The report by Moore on his visit with Dr. Perry in early December 1963, is in this collection. If there are more reports by Moore on visits to Parkland, they might be in Inspector Thomas Kelley's papers (if there is such a collection at the Secret Service), which ARRB has requested (SS-12).
