letter dated June 14, 1996, I reached Jerrol Custer on the phone at 2:16 P.M. today, and once again asked him
if I could arrange a telephone interview with him at a date and time of his convenience. He said that he really
didn't want to be involved in any more discussions about the Kennedy assassination; he complained that
people bother him all the time on the telephone, and said that he was simply tired of it. I reminded him that
the Federal government had not yet interviewed him about events related to the Kennedy assassination, and
that this was his chance to pass on his recollections to an impartial body; I told him that he was an important
witness to history and that we would like very much to interview him. He again declined, and said he was
sorry, but that he just didn't want to discuss these matters anymore, and ended the telephone call.Analyst
