Call:After I left a message with his secretary, Dr. Robert Grossman returned my call. He confirmed that he had  
received ARRB's letter of February 7, 1997, "with great interest," he said. I asked him if our impression that he  
was present in Trauma Room One during the treatment of President Kennedy on 11/22/63 was correct, and  
he confirmed that he was indeed present. I asked him if he was able to observe the President's wounds in  
1963, and he said "oh yes, you don't forget, you know." I asked him if it were true that he had never been  
interviewed by the Government, and he said that he had never yet been contacted by any Government  
official.He readily consented to a taped interview by ARRB staff in his offices in Houston, and asked that we  
conduct the interview on either March 19 (Wed) or March 21 (Fri), in the afternoon. I told him I would call him  
within a week or so to confirm the date and time, and he said fine.Subsequent to this telephone call, I  
discussed the two options with Jeremy Gunn, and received direction to schedule this interview for Friday,
