I have discussed the possibility of doing the film scanning at the Archive with my staff. It will require very careful planning on our part--to make sure we bring everything we need--and will convert some "soft" costs into clear dollar outlays. We will have to get our service department to package the scanner, ship it to Washington, and install it there--and then do the same to get it back here. We estimate that there would be a fixed cost of \$10,000 to bring the scanning equipment to Washington and do the scanning there. Just to set reasonable expectations, we would need 4-6 weeks of leadtime from approval to do all the pretests and move the equipment. I do not know what photographic processing/printing capabilities are available at the Archive, but we planned to make a photographic copy of the "three images" (item 1) and scan the copy. We may be able to scan them directly, but planned to try it both ways. Thank you!
