The meeting was a result of ARRB's April 21, 1997 letter to Mr. Hagget regarding the Clemard Joseph Charles file. Mr. Hagget had the file copied at IRR and delivered to the Pentagon for a detailed review by ARRB staff. Prior to reviewing the document he stated that he saw nothing in this file which the Army would want to redact. He felt that the outstanding issue in this case would be the third agency equities.Horne and Masih reviewed the 137 page file and found that nineteen documents approximating forty pages were likely to be assassination records. These documents essentially provide information detailing Baron George DeMohrenschildt's business relations with Mr. Charles, his personal and business travel and his contacts with Sam Goodhue Kail of Army Intelligence and Tony Czaikowski of CIA. Some documents also refer to a pre-assassination association between Vice-President Johnson and George DeMohrenschildt, and the fact that Demorenschildt was planning to personally introduce Mr. Charles to LBJ circa April-May 1963.Following our review of the file we spoke with Mr. Hagget and he reiterated his belief that there is nothing in the file the Army would hold back. He said that he would RIF the tagged pages and send the referrals out to CIA.Don't forget to compose individual Action Item documents for any action items that came from the meeting!

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
