No attempt should be made to contact him. -- David Marwelll met with Gus Russo, David Marwell and Cinda Elser on June 26, 1995. Cinda is an independent private investigator who specializes in finding hard to locate individuals. She is a friend of Russo's and has performed investigative work for him, Tony Summers, the Frontline program on PBS, and a number of public and private organizations. Cinda was in Washington for a meeting (she lives in Ohio) and she took the occassion to meet with me in the event the Review Board needs to hire her investigative skills. She bills at \$25.00 an hour, plus computer on-line time and expenses. She said that some cases, which involve extraordinary amounts of time or other efforts, additional costs may be assessed (ie. a flat rate in lieu of an hourly rate) but that she would discuss all of this with a client before proceeding. Russo provided information concerning Marty Underwood and his knowledge of Fabian Escalante, the alleged "mystery passenger" on flights in and out of Mexico City and Havana in September, 1963 and just after the assassination. According to Russo, Underwood became a Kennedy family confidante and assistant when he helped Kenny O'Donnell, in conjunction with Mayor Dailey, to rig the Chicago elections in JFK's favor. Prior to that time Underwood had been associated with Sam Giancana. Underwood allegedly (based on what he told Russo) assisted Joe Kennedy in setting up telephone lines from Milwaukee to Chicago which were used to facilitate vote rigging and the buying of votes.Russo claims Underwood, who is now 80 years old but looks and acts 60, has never spoken with a journalist or anyone else about his exploits for the Kennedy's and LBJ before this time, although he received "one line" mentions in William Manchester's book about JFK and in Jack Valente's book. After the 1960 election Underwood was brought to the White House/Kennedy family staff although his name never appeared on any White House personnel lists. He was given a title and position in the Commerce Department, although he told Russo that in the eight years he worked for Commerce he "never once did anything for them." Rather, Underwood's work for the White House involved acting as an advance man for Kennedy's trips. During an advance/planning trip to Mexico City in 1962 he claims to have met Win Scott. When JFK was assassinated Underwood moved to the Johnson White House and continued to work as an advance man and became a confidante of LBJ's. In 1968, during the "height of feuding between RFK and LBJ" the latter was concerned about "two cancers; Vietnam and allegations I killed JFK." LBJ allegedly told Underwood to find out "what your Record

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
