Body: CALL REPORTDocument's Author: Douglas Horne/ARRB Date Created: 07/02/97 The Players Description of the Call Date: 07/02/97Subject: Doug Horne Called Jack MatthewsSummary of the Call:I called Jack Matthews today to get his mailing address.He told me that there is no one single declassifier in the Army equipped to deal with the categories of documents which we have identified as being present in the Califano Papers. He said that in addition to sending his employee Toni Bowie, he is going to arrange for a declassifier from Army Intelligence, and another from the Army General Counsel's Office, to come to the declassification session July 21-24. He said he may even come himself. He cautioned that the people from outside his office, however, may only be able to stay for one day.He told me he used to be a Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army, until he was told one year ago to start his new agency. He also told me he was an attorney. He said he suspects there may be attorney-client privilege issues involved here, and said he thinks this declassification process may take quite a while to accomplish.I said that the important thing was that we started the process, and developed methodologies for how the group declassification session was to proceed. END
