ED OF GIFTFOR THE HISTORICAL MATERIALS OFTOM ALYEA1. In accordance with the provisions of chapter 21 of title 44, United States Code, and subject to the terms, conditions, and restrictions set forth in this instrument, Tom Alyea (the "Donor") gave, donated, and conveyed to the United States of America, for deposit in the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection (the "JFK Collection") at the National Archives and Records Administration (National Archives), the following historical materials (hereinafter referred to as the Donated Materials):One reel of approximately 1,200 feet of 16 mm film which records events related to the assassination of President Kennedy and the criminal trial of Jack Ruby. A description of the film is attached at Appendix A.2. The Donor warrants that, at the time of the delivery of the Donated Materials to the JFK Assassination Records Review Board, he possessed title to, and all rights and interest in, the Donated Materials free and clear of all liens, claims, charges, or encumbrances.3. The Donor gives, donates, and assigns to the United States all intellectual property interest that he now possesses in the Donated Materials, except that, during the Donors lifetime, the Donor retains to himself all copyrights in his historical materials donated to the United States of America under the terms of this instrument or which may be included in other collections of papers or historical materials deposited in the national archival system. Upon the Donors death, all said rights shall pass to the Government.4. The JFK Assassination Records Review Board will instruct the Archivist of the United States (the "Archivist") to add the Donated Materials to the JFK Collection in accordance with the provisions of title 44, United States Code, section 2107.5. Once the Donated Materials are included in the JFK Collection, the Donor may freely examine them during the working hours of the depository at which they are being maintained.6. The Donor may, upon request and from time to time, obtain reproductions of any or all of the Donated Materials. The Archivist, or his or her designee, shall determine at the time of each request whether reproductions are to be provided free of charge or, in the alternative, for a fee set in accordance with the provisions of chapter 21 of title 44, United States Code.7.
