He said that Kodak's present plans are to have the report reviewed and signed by Kodak management officials WITHOUT the photographic materials/images present--a change over previous plans which would simplify matters greatly. If Kodak's interim decision to sign a report without images present were to change, then he will be back in touch with either me or Jeremy Gunn, and the options would then be for a NARA employee to travel to Rochester with the thermal images, or for a Kodak employee to travel to Washington with the report and review the report alongside the images in the Archives. He thanked ARRB again for the personalized thank you letters sent to Kodak employees; he said our action was deeply appreciated on a personal level by many of the recipients, and that NONE of the personnel assigned to "Special Project A" were impacted by the most recent Kodak downsizing, which just took place a few days ago. I asked him to speak with Jeremy Gunn later this month in the event he called and I was absent
