**Subject:** Gus Russo Call

Gus Russo called yesterday wanting to talk with you. In your absence Janice routed the call to me. He offered a tip on the possibility of the existence of records on a topic of some interest to him- the alleged debriefing by the CIA of Oswald when he returned from the Soviet Union. He cited an HSCA record (015068, box 290), which he describes as an outside contact report of an HSCA interview with Donald Deneslya, a CIA officer who worked in the foreign records division, Soviet Branch. Mr. Russo said that Deneslya had seen records that described the debriefing of an American defector who had lived in Minsk. This he saw in a file on industrial intelligence which was filed in a volume that concerned the industrial registry branch, a branch that was a component of central records. I thanked Mr. Russo for the tip and promised to forward it to you. Next Mr. Russo tried to probe for information. He said that he is interested in CIA assets in the Cuban embassy in Mexico City. I responded to him that we understand Mexico City is an important part of the assassination story and that we were doing everything possible to accomplish a thorough review of the records in that area. I again thanked Mr. Russo for his help.
