He said he would write a letter to them, documenting the fact that the Secret Service consents to the release of these materials. Also - John did some extra research into the "usher logs" question and found that when he punched in "White House Usher" on the Internet, he found that the Gerald Ford Library keeps these sorts of logs. The Internet entry referred to them as "Staff Appointment Logs" that were kept by the White House. These logs recorded the individuals who met with staff members in the West Wing of the White House. Apparently, the Ford Library has them arranged chronologically in folders. John is going to continue his research into this question.
