There is also another RIF for a later (June 78) document from NYPD to Blakey, re: Carlos Marcello. This latter document (2 page letter) is referred, but I can look at it on Tuesday when I'm down at Archives I and see if it provides any clues about the HSCA/NYPD interface. The HSCA collection also contains a cover letter and 3 page NYPD file on the "mysterious" death of Dorothy Kilgallen, Ruby witness and panelist on What's My Line.
