Anne received in the mail today Nelson DELGADO's service records (both USMC and U.S. Army service). Like Oswald and 1st LT Ayers, he was discharged from El Toro MCAS in the Autumn of 1959. When discharged from the Marine Corps, he too (like Oswald and Ayers) received a DD-1173 I.D. card. However, lest anyone begin to think this is normal, the paragraph of the PRAM which is cited as authorization "does not compute". It may have been standard practice in that unit to issue that card, but the PRAM does NOT authorize its issue, no matter how many service record entries were made saying so. Anne is forwarding 9 additional requests for USMC enlisted service record information to St. Louis, to broaden our "control study" base. No doubt some or all of these people will have been discharged at units OTHER THAN El Toro; those results (vis-a-vis I.D. card issued) should be significant. END
