Yesterday she said that they do have material (and I may inventory it as I have requested), but that the material is not for sale. She said that when they receive inquiries about the JFK material, that they refer people to the "4 Days" book. I still wonder why they would maintain such material if they don't plan to sell it? I would not be surprised by another twist on their account of records. Her initial denial of any material pertaining to the Nix & Muchmore films, changed to her saying they have copies. I have checked with people here to ask how to determine if their Nix & Muchmore stuff are originals. Either way, I can still do an accountability for their records (which I don't anticipate not being able to handle) & then we can make a better decision regarding acquiring the material from them.
