Two items. First, I am profoundly embarrassed to say that, despite several counts in the day(s) running up to the meeting, there were 172, not 170, staff payroll records in the 3 boxes. This number does not include the six pulled for separate Board review, meaning that there were 178 (not 176) staff payroll records reviewed by the Board. More importantly (hopefully), 11 of these records (staff payroll folders) have no NARA RIF's. I don't mean just that there are no RIF's present in the folder; I mean that NARA never generated a RIF for these 11 folders. I presume that we need to tell NARA this and have the RIF's created so that we can list them in the Federal Register? Please advise. Presumably you should tell Chris or Matt and have them generate the new RIFs. Ask Kevin if he has a better idea. We do need to have the RIFs.
