This morning I returned a phonemail message from Max Holland. He was interested in whether SOLO material regarding Moscow's reaction to the assassination had been provided in any form to the Warren Commission. He said that in last year's SOLO release, there was an internal FBI 1976 memorandum saying that a file search had been conducted and indicated that no such dissemination had been made to the Warren Commission. However, John Barret's (sp?) upcoming book on SOLO (which Holland has in proof form) states that such dissemination was made to the Warren Commission. On a related point, he wonders how the SOLO report on Castro's reaction to the assassination came to be provided to the Warren Commission. I told him that I would see what could be found.
