Joe, the citation is as follows: pages 32 and 33 of the 4/30/64 Executive Session Transcript, as printed in Weisberg's Post Mortem, self-published, 1975 (pages 550-551). I know of no documents which indicate Humes saw the materials with any Commission member. During their 1996 ARRB depositions, Humes and Boswell both stated emphatically and without hesitation under oath that they did not see the photos for the first time until November 1, 1966. So, if Chief Justice Warren saw the photos with a doctor (as discussed in Executive Session on 4/30/64), it was not with Humes or Boswell. There's also no indication as to who was with him when he looked at them, eg., a medical expert (or autopsy doctor) who could interpret the materials for him. Question: do you know of any questions on record, either in the past or recently (i.e.: the ARRB depositions of Humes, Boswell, etc.) that would nail down whether or not Humes might have joined Warren in viewing them? Thanks.
