So, we are currently in limbo... waiting for the Army to declass them or claim their redactions before we review them... but the Army is waiting for us to review them before they declass them... and no one has set the process in motion. I suppose since they are just sitting there, you and I could go up to work on them at some point ... though I don't think preliminary review will be done any time soon. I have spent the better part of four days up there, reviewing them all day long, and I have only completed a box and a half of the six boxes that exist. I think it would take us at least three more days of work.
