**Subject:** Re: CIA consent documents

The Consent Release documents that are almost ready for NARA total 282. Some of these have been here since May. They come from Oswald's 201 file and span a wide area both in time and subject matter. The earliest is an FBI memo from 1962 which describes a number of defectors living in the USSR; the latest is a 1977 CIA memo that outlines allegations made by a Soviet émigré who alleged that when Oswald lived in Minsk he had bragged he would kill the President. As usual, there are the documents which relate to characters in the Mexico City story, for example, Elana Garro de Paz, Silvia Duran, and Eusebio Azcue. Included also is Oswald's Cuban Visa application. We find in this group, CIA correspondence with the Warren Commission. There are documents which discuss Oswald's activities in the USSR and there is a draft of a 1967 defector study. Oswald in Helsinki and checks on items in his address book are also subjects covered in this release. Even Garrison era documents can be found here. This is only a sample, but I hope that it demonstrates the variety of material found in this batch of documents.
