Per your direction, I followed up our 8/13 letter with a call to John Sabotka today. For long version, see Agency Contacts database. Short version: Eastland Papers at U. Miss contain files of Eastland's personal Senate office; not Committee files. Sabotka, who organized and shipped this stuff from DC to Miss. almost 20 years ago, doesn't believe there are assassination records in the Papers, but agreed to send us a large folder-by-folder finding aid he put together at the time. If we see anything we think warrants examination, he'll pull the records and take a look at them for us. The records are closed, as Max Holland (who had spoken to Sabotka yesterday, as it happens) told us, but Sabotka supposed that, if we actually found something, Eastland's son (who seems to have, or thinks he has, the say so) would waive the restrictions and allow it to be opened and sent to the JFK Collection. I then called Max Holland and gave him a brief rundown of the above.
