I was at National Archives today looking at FBI files and came across a reference to a CIA recorded interview with a witness in Mexico City, regarding I presume the Mexico City trip of Oswald. The person interviewed was G.N. Alvarado Ugarte, and the interview was summarized in a Nov. 29, 1963 CIA memo. In addition, there was a reference to a taperecording of the interview ("Copies of the tapes have been obtained from the CIA office here and are being forwarded to the Bureau by separate communication."). I was curious if this was a significant witness and whether or not this material has been released by the CIA.--Ron
