The Secret Service records arrived on Friday afternoon, December 20th. Cathy looked for you as soon as they arrived, but found that you had left for the day. Cathy showed them to me on Monday morning, December 23. Because you were out of the office for the week, I asked Cathy to put them in the SCIF, pending your return. The tone of your e-mails suggests some irritation with how this was handled. Based upon what I know, I think that this matter was handled entirely properly. I am at a loss as to why you have chosen to send e-mails (that sound to me as if they were written in an accusatory tone) rather than orally ask a simple question and get the simple answer.
