FileSummary of the Meeting I met with Mr. Hogarth today in order

to review the file on a 1970's ATF investigation of John Thomas Mason. The file contained well-documented evidence of violations of federal firearms laws that ultimately led to Mason's 1979 indictment and 1980 conviction for selling firearms without a license. The file contained only a citation and brief reference to ATF's 1963-64 investigation and conviction of Mason. This earlier conviction created legal restrictions on Mason's subsequent involvement with firearms. The documents I reviewed do not enhance our knowledge of Mason's activities in Dallas around the time of the assassination.
