In response to our inquiries, she has reviewed all of the agenda and minutes from November 1963 to October 1964, and intends to complete the review through November 1964. She has stated that she has seen no mention of the assassination other than for a PFIAB meeting that happened to be held on the day of the assassination and at which the PFIAB members were informed of the assassination. Given this, I recommend that we NOT review the minutes given PFIAB's representation that the minutes have been reviewed and there are no assassination-related discussions. I think we should simply review the inventory (or index) of their project files, which Tim rather than Jeremy can do. Once we review the inventory, we can summarize in a lettter to PFIAB what record searches have been done and what the results were. Do you agree? Let me know because I need to call Gwen back to finalize arrangements for our review.
