To: David Marwell/ARRB, Jeremy Gunn/ARRB Cc: Ron Haron/ARRB Date: 04/09/97 10:41:49 AM Subject: NSC Records In connection with making sure that the Review Board has located and identified NSC records that may relate to the assassination, I spoke with Steve Tilley (at Jeremy's suggestion) to get his input as to what additional steps, if any, we should undertake. Steve Tilley advised me as follows: NSC records were first transferred to NARA in 1983, and those records cover the NSC from the Truman to Johnson administrations. Records from the Nixon administration forward have been retained by the NSC. One category of NSC records that were not at NARA were the records for the NSC's Intelligence Directorate (including the 303 Committee). Recently, Mr. Tilley learned that certain NSC records were in the custody of the CIA. Therefore, Mr. Tilley recommended that we obtain an accounting of relevant NSC records that may be retained by the NSC/CIA. Specifically, he suggested we contact the NSC (he suggested Bill Leary at NSC, 202-456-9201) and the CIA's Office of Administration. Mr. Tilley also mentioned that NSC Intelligence Directorate records may contain material relating to Operation Mongoose. I suggest we contact Mr. Leary of the NSC informally, followed up by a formal written request that the NSC locate and identify any assassination records. I will not make any contact until you decide how to proceed.
