AMSubject: Re: CIA recordsThese records were a sampling of intelligence that the CIA provided to USSS immediately after the assassination - running the gamut from the 10-page Duran report to the story of the Moroccan who supposedly knew Marina as a disenchanted commie before she married Oswald, and various reports that had come in with tidbits about "who did it?" plus cables that verified Marina and Lee's journey from Moscow. However, the CIA did not provide anything that revealed its technical operations in Mexico City at the time, i.e. no pre-assassination intercepts. Joan was interested in whether the CIA was giving the Secret Service the most accurate picture of available intelligence that the latter needed to do its job or whether it was selectively doling it out. I don't believe there was anything new in this batch of documents, however, there was a report about Oswald's FPCC dealings which concerns an individual, one of our "hold" issues, we are interested in.
