He did leave a voice mail with me, sometime in May. I have intended for some time to get back to him, but have not yet done so. I am up to my neck in big projects all this month--and all are "behind the power curve," as the aviators say. I do not anticipate getting back to him myself this month. Here's the gist of his message--I did take notes:USAF Officer Jim McAndrews told Judge he had found records of cable traffic from U.S. to Japan which somehow involved an FBI agent who was in Dallas before the assassination. The agent was requested by the cable to provide info on Oswald, Ruby, etc.Judge offered to provide a way to contact McAndrews (presumably a phone number, and perhaps the name of his command, or a job title).Appreciate your desire to follow through on what to me is a gnat on my radar screen this summer. I know that presumably this could be important, but I am surrounded by gigantic alligators now, I'm not having any fun beating them back, and I don't have time for things like this right now. I also don't have time for the 45 minute phone call that would go with this.Thanks.
