I exchanged several messages with Steve Tilley today. He now has a copy of the recent Alyea letter. Right now the Archives will not show (much less make copies of) the film without a Deed of Gift. Tilley also said that the Archives has never excluded a clause in a Deed of Gift stipulating that researchers can obtain copies of materials in the JFK Collection. My impression from this particular voicemail message is that the Archives will not sign the DOG if Alyea insists that copies not be made. Tilley said Alyea would maintain the copyright, but it is up to Alyea to make sure no one violates that. Steve is out of the office next week (as you both are) so we can take this up when everyone gets back. Steve suggested that we talk to Amy Krupsky (sp?) in the General Counsel's office if we have additional questions.
