She took back the originals that Wessel had packed up into a box. The questions: (1) Where is the box of originals? (2) Were copies ever made? (3) Are the tape transcripts, in fact, with that material that Laura brought back?
 In addition to being interested in the transcripts, I am interested in the rest of the Connick files because we should do an announcement, at the appropriate time, that they are available to the public. We should also find out that if the Archives (Dave Brown) will need to do some processing of the files before they are made public. I am assuming that processing is necessary and appropriate. Any information on these matters will be appreciated.
