Okay. The numbers nightmare is now over. I think we have it figured out. The NSA delivered 87 documents to us in spring 1997. After an examination of these records, the Board made the following decisions: 75 were postponed in part; 4 copies and final determination notices for these 75 are ready) 3 were postponed in full (these 3 have final determination notices but no redacted copy attached (because they are postponed in full)) 144-10001-10103; 144-10001-10110; 144-10001-10115; 6 were released in full ("consent releases") (we have clear copies for these but no final determination notices for these 6 docs (no PDF needed because they have already been officially declassified by NSA) 144-10001-10026; 144-10001-10064; 144-10001-10123; 144-10001-10137; 144-10001-10141; 144-10001-10142; 1 will be referred to the JFK task force @ FBI (awaiting NSA instructions on referral procedure) 144-10001-10050; 2 were pulled for "reconsideration" (awaiting NSA/ARRB negotiations) 144-10001-10155 (at ARRB request) 144-10001-10153 (at NSA request)-----
