 Thank you for the response. That is good news that Doug will reach out to Tague again. I recently spoke to a soon-to-be author named Larry Sneed, whose name I got from Max Holland. He is writing a book of oral histories of witnesses connected to the assassination. He has spoken with Tague and thought Tague's recollections would be important for the JFK Collection, although noted that Tague is a difficult person to deal with. As I mentioned in my original e-mail, the other person Sneed mentioned was D.L. Jackson, a motorcycle police officer who was in the presidential motorcade. He apparently wrote down his recollections the evening of the assassination. Sneed told me on Friday that Jackson died several years ago. Although I have little information on him, it would be worth pursuing if we could track down Jackson's relatives to see if they have his written account of the assassination. I would guess that D.L. Jackson was between 25-40 years old in 1963 when he was a motorcycle cop. He lived in Dallas and died in the 1980's, according to Sneed. Let me know if you can do anything with this little amount of information. Again, thanks for the update.
