Subject: Re: Document Referrals

There are two categories of referrals that apply to CIA records: those that we coordinate and those that the CIA and the other agencies coordinate. For the most part, records from the second category do not appear on our radar until the referral has been completed. There have been exceptions with CIA and FBI records and with one or two other agencies. We might discuss if this policy should continue in our last year. I have tried to keep inventories of records that have gone through me to CIA, but this has not been a perfect science. Records of referrals that we have coordinated may or may not be complete. In most cases, I would think that our staff member who is responsible for the agency whose documents needed referral would have a better handle on the status of the referrals in question. Agencies for which I have information readily available are:-INS-62 records referred to CIA 11/96 -5/97; all have been returned-Ford library & Rockefeller Commission-60 or more records have been returned from CIA after referral. Sydney has inventories for Ford library referrals. NARA (Warren Commission)-142 referred to CIA 5/97, none returnedDIA-3 referred to CIA, all returnedHSCA-ongoing. Joan tracks outstanding referrals with our database.FBI ---> CIA; CIA ---> FBI-ongoing. Most are moving along well. A small percentage have difficult issues.I will continue to search for
