 I am not calling Anne Winner on matters involving tutorial instruction, or deadlines. That will all be in our letter. Whatever I have told her in the past has either been misunderstood, or has gone in one ear and out the other. What is in writing from this agency is all that matters, henceforth--and only written products will protect us, by providing an accurate and unambiguous record of what direction we have provided. Telephone conversations between government officials are over-rated in value, because both sides can represent them in any way one wishes, and there is too much room for misunderstanding. That is my position. I will speak to her on the phone if she has a technical question which she raises with me directly, such as how to obtain RIF software, or how to create RIFs.
