Bennett called Hunger and asked for a meeting. Hunger agreed. Hunger asked Cohen what the issue was.

When Cohen explained, Hunger's first reaction was "I'll bet the film is worth zillions." I asked Cohen whether it is unusual for a litigant to schedule a meeting with Hunger. He said it is highly unusual at this stage of the process. I asked what is likely to happen and whether we should attempt to weigh in. Cohen said that Hunger won't make any decision during his meeting with Bennett, and that Hunger is likely to want to work out a settlement. I said that, to the extent the question is simply about money, we are interested but have no desire to crash the party. I said that to the extent that there is a question about the Board's authority, we do want to weigh in. He said that was understandable. He said that I should contact Hunger directly if I believed I should. He said that he also would inform Hunger of our interest. I will write a short letter to Hunger advising him of our interest and our desire to participate in any discussions that concern our interests.I had lunch with Dagoberto Rodriguez of the Cuban Interests Section. It went very well. He would like to pursue the issue, and he said he will follow up today.
