We have a file of what he turned over to us...documents already in the HSCA files. He did not turn over any contemporaneous notes. The sole value of his visit, other than providing names of some officials with whom he dealt (1959-1964), was to tell us that he remembers that ONI conducted an investigation of Oswald's defection in late 1959, and that he remembers seeing the investigative reports ("119 reports") of the field agents come across his desk in late 1959 or early 1960. No such documents have been found by NCIS or ONI. Only "119 Reports" from the post-assassination period are in the JFK Collection (in HSCA files).
