Subject: Gordon Winslow Telephone Call

Gordon mentioned several interesting things in a telephone conversation which I had with him today. 1. He received the definition guidance and mentioned the following two areas of concern: 1. The guidance should be strong enough to obtain relevant records from state and local government. 2. The guidance should be strong enough to capture important records in the possession of private parties. I suggested that Gordon submit his comments in writing to the Board by March 10, 1995. 2. He alleges that the FBI took possession of relevant records from both the Metro police and the City police in Miami prior to the assassination. It sounded like this was in connection with Kennedy's visit to Miami in November 1963. He stated that the problem is that the Bureau took original records and did not leave receipts on what they had taken. His question: where are these records? 3. Gordon said that the Garrison family has the late Jim Garrison's files which should definitely be of interest to the Board. He added that author Jim DiEugenio may have negotiated a deal with the Garrison family to use the files. 2
