  - -- If MEBU fails CSS "A" side will be activated.



- 1. (S) On 4 June 1980 a group headed by Brigadier General McIlmoyle, J-3, was assembled to assess all aspects of the 3 June 1980 false event. group consisted of Joint Staff members with the expertise and skill to assess, as pertains to the 3 June 1980 event: (a) Command Post controller procedures, authorities and mission requirements; (b) the Command Center Processing Display System computer hardware and software; (c) the status of the NORAD 427M missile warning computer system; and (d) the actions of each agencies' Command Post computer testing and maintenance personnel involved in the 3 June event.
- 2. (U) Dr. Harry L. VanTrees, Principal DASD(C3I) has also initiated actions to form a highly technically qualified group to determine precisely the deficiencies in the 427M and GCPBS. Once the deficiencies are determined, Dr. VanTrees is prepared to take such action as is required to support priority correction of those deficiencies.
- 3. (S) Brigadier General McIlmoyle met with Dr. VanTrees and discussed the above courses of action and agreed to conduct separate yet fully coordinated actions in assessing the 3 June 80 event. As a result, Dr. VanTrees, Brigadier General McIlmoyle and a staff of six will visit SAC and NORAD on 5 June for four hours each. This visit will entail review of logs, checklists, mission requirements, and the interview of Command Post controllers, supporting staff, computer operators and maintenance personnel on duty during the 3 June event. This same group will visit the Alternate National Military Command Center on 6 June in order to perform the same assessments at that location.

- 1. (U) Of the 42 original action items in the 9 Nov 79 NORAD Action Item List, 30 have been closed out. Of the remaining 12, four are nearing finalization, and are described in paragraph 2 below. The remaining eight are of a long-term nature; they should be relegated to the normal staff process. They are summarized in paragraph 3 below and will be brought to your attention upon completion.
- 2. (S) The following four items are in the final phase of their staffing and are summarized here. Since the 3/6 June false warning, indications have lent renewed emphasis to these, they are being reported under separate staff procedures. This is therefore the final summary under this "NORAD Action Item List."
  - a. (S) The system providing for alarm level exchange (ALEX) between NORAD and the Fylingdales BMEWS site has been reviewed and extensively tested. It did not function properly on 9 November 79. This effort has been essentially overtaken by progress made on the JCS approved NORAD/ADCOM Concept of Operations for Provision of Ballistic Missile Attack Warning to Europe. Under this near-term concept, full duplex high speed communications will be established between NORAD and UK users to transmit new European warning messages now under development at NORAD.
  - b. (S) NORAD as well as SAC was requested to evaluate the merits of installing a low-speed teletype back-up device from PAVE PAWS (similar to the present Teletype User Data Entry (TUDE) system from the DSP). Air Force did not support this effort, citing the voice site confidence check requirements and dual phenomenology (DSP) as sufficient to back up the PAVE PAWS reports. SAC proposed an expanded concept whereby low speed PAVE PAWS data would be combined with the NORAD high speed lines and the DSP ground communications network (GCN) and be processed to a single display terminal. This approach was endorsed and SAC was invited to develop a statement of need for HQ USAF processing. NORAD continues

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to study this item. However, the need for NORAD to directly connect the DSP and PAVE PAWS sensors in a manner similar to the SAC and NMCC systems has become apparent as a result of the 3/6 June incidents. This item continues to be pursued by separate staff action.

- c. (S) Another item being worked by NORAD was the revision of the language used to portray sensor site confidence, etc., in warning conferences. NORAD has employed the AF Human Engineering Laboratory to assist them in this effort. A report from that agency is due at NORAD on 23 June 80. This task is also re-emphasized by the 3/6 June incidents and continues under separate staff action.
- d. (S) The quality of the NORAD Alert System (NAS) circuitry came under review as a result of the 9 November incident. This system has been subjected to a review by NORAD and a full review by AT&T was recommended in light of the need to improve the quality and reliability of the system. NORAD will work this upgrade through Service channels as fiscal needs become identified. The AT&T review nears completion.
- 3. (S) The following eight items are long term and will, as stated above, continue to be pursued but will only be reported as they are completed or upon other significant developments.
  - a. (C) Relocation of CINCNORAD's office or other action to insure his immediate access in the event of missile warning emergency. CINCNORAD continues to review alternatives.
  - b. (S) Review of FAA procedures during national missile warning emergencies has resulted in C3S concern over the number/size/content of tours and visitors to the FAA centers. A DJS memo to the Director, FAA is in staff process.
  - c. (S) The NORAD proposal for upgrade of the Command Director slots to 0-7 awaits the G.O. morning review by HQ USAF scheduled in August.
  - d. (C) The CCPDS problem of commonality at all centers continues. Efforts to overcome this deficiency include the development of a CCPDS integration plan and continuing display redesign efforts.
  - e. (S) Recognition of the system wide vulnerability to the HEMP threat has resulted in continuing Service addressal of possible long-term negation programs.
  - f. (S) The provision of better, more timely tactical warning data to ABNCPs is a known requirement. Alternatives are under review.



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g. (C) The completion of the action for alleviating the basic cause of the 9 November incident has been expanded to cover the areas involved in the 3/6 June incidents. These include the SAC alerting net and the PACOM ABNCP. C3S will continue efforts to overcome these deficiencies whenever feasible.
