

31. Minuteman Missile, Ellsworth AFB, South Dakota - On December 5, 1964, a retrocket fired on a Minuteman missile dislodging the Re-entry Vehicle which contained a Mk-56 warhead. The RV fell 75 feet to the floor of the silo. A response team consisting of D. P. Dickason and R. K. Peterson, S/C (Livermore) proceeded to the scene where they were later joined by N. D. Benedict, LRL. The RV was successfully hoisted out of the silo in a cargo net through use of a mobile crane and was transported to Medina for post mortem.

32. Bunker Hill AFB, Indiana - On December 8, 1964, a B-58 skidded off the runway and burned while taking part in an Operational Readiness Inspection.
