Dear Mr. Greenewald:

This responds to your request under the Freedom of Information Act dated 16 September 1996. Therein you requested records from 1969 to 1979 concerning Unidentified Flying Objects. A search of DIA's systems of records located 16 documents responsive to the subject of your request. Of these, one was previously provided to you in response to another request, case number 0591-96.

Enclosed for your use are 12 documents with only administrative markings withheld.

Upon review, it was determined some portions of two documents are not releasable. The portions withheld are exempt from release pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(1), (b)(2), and (b)(6), Freedom of Information Act. Subsection (b)(1) applies to information properly classified under the criteria provided by Executive Order 12958. Subsection (b)(2) applies to information which pertains solely to the internal rules and practices of the Agency. Subsection (b)(6) applies to information which if released would constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of other individuals. All reasonably segregable portions of the documents are attached hereto.

All substantive portions of the remaining document are not releasable. The information withheld is exempt from release pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(1), (b)(2), and (b)(6), Freedom of Information Act. There are no reasonably segregable portions of this exempt material.

that the Investigation Center for Unidentified Objects (ICUO) was established, which maintains that the UFO's exist, that they are machines, and that they are of extrateratorial origin. Simultaneously another man - Raul Rincon Pareja - eight years ago devoted himself to astronomy and became concerned with the enigma of the flying saucers. In this capacity Rincon Pareja has certainly come to be the Uruguayan with the most information on the subject. Moreover, he owns two telescopes: one is an azimuthal reflector; the second one is 30 centimeters in diameter and 2.10 meters in focal distance, with a 760 enlargement.

CASES IN URUGUAY

Incidents recorded by ICUO for Uruguay from 1950 up to the present time amount to 200 observations. The following is obtained from a study made of 60 absolutely confirmed cases: 72.6% were made by civilian observers; 18.6% by technicians (astronomers, pilots, meteorologists), and 8.8% by military persons.

In a meticulous job by ICUO, numerous cases are recorded. One of them is very interesting because it refers to an official document of Carrasco National Airport. On 1 March 1954, the Tower Control Chief, Pedro V. Ocampo, reported to the Airport Chief that he had observed a "moving serial body of an extraordinary shape and speed."

At approximately 1430, Ocampo and the ACC operator, Mrs. de Rizzardo, were observing the sky in a northeasterly direction when they were able to localize an oval-shaped object which, while remaining stationary, quickly changed shape. "With our attention concentrated, we located it at 30° azimuth and at a vertical angle of 15°," he said.

NO INFORMATION

Immediately following, they observed another similar form, but a smaller one, which was located below and then behind, quite close, both of them making a vertical oscillating ascent, only to disappear rapidly. After five minutes the ACC operator again observed it, with an azimuth from 120° to 130° and a vertical height of 20°, with an oval-like shape and a very fine extension, and two smaller discs on its extremities.

When she turned to take the binoculars, the object shifted position at high speed toward the west, and when she got it in focus, it was over the Minas mountain range, disappearing. Later, a radio broadcasting station called the Tower by telephone "asking for information as to whether we had observed anything in the sky. We didn't give any information".

The ICUO, after analyzing an infinite number of cases, concluded that the "shape, propulsion, the effects caused in its drive, the speed and performance reported by the UFOS's provide the guide lines showing that behind the flying saucers there is an intelligence that creates and drives them.

PILOTS ALSO

From a large collection of portfolios in his possession, Rincon Pareja selected one example because of its documentary value. On 19 December 1960 the crew of a PLUMA plane - CX-AQJ - under command of Juan José Figueroa, reported an episode that had happened to him. The plane took off from Carrasco at 2230. Five minutes afterwards he received a message from the Control Tower asking him whether he had observed any strange object in his flight line.

The Tower asked that question after having received many telephone calls from Pocitos and Malvin stating that a Clying saucer had been seen. At that time the plane was leaving the Uruguayan coast and was flying over the neighborhood of

the Cero. Underneath it appeared what crew members described as an oval object which seemed like an airship driven by a speed changing every few seconds.

The contrivance gave off sparks having a luminosity ranging between white and an intense red. Moments later it was no longer seen.

A COMCLUSION

From all these incidents Rincon Pareja draws the conclusion that the flying saucers are considerably more than a collective optical illusion, and that behind them powerful forces are being moved that he understands belong to more developed beings than the inhabitants of the earth.

"The stopping of motors, silencing of radios, radars, and the discharge of the platters are actions from an electromagnetic field created by the flying saucers. This same field would maintain an atmosphere around the airships by which they would be able to displace themselves in interstellar space, in the gaseous medium surrounding the earth, and even go inside the depth of our seas," Rincon Pareja says.

COMMENT: During the past several months there have been numerous reports of so-called "flying saucers".



General Situation:

- The time of discovery was approximately several minutes after 1900 hours July. The time of discovery over Hsin-chu was probably misquoted.
- h. The points of discovery spread all over Taiwan.
- c. The colors of the light objects included red, blue and white.
- d. With the exception of Tung-yin, no altitude was indicated.
- e. With the exception of I-lan and Koan Kuang, no direction was indicated.
- Study:
 - a. On the basis of their time of discovery over a wide area:
- longitude 120.1 and 121.7 (between Tung-yin and I-lan), between north latitude 22 and 26.2 (between Heng-ch'un and Tung-yin). They covered an area 460 kilometers from north to south and 160 kilometers from east to west. It is felt that there must have been a greater number spread over a wide area on the nearby sea and ocean that were not seen. On the basis of the extent of the area over which these objects dere discovered, they could not have come from any weapon that had been fired from the ground. Although they fell over a wide area, their time of descent was very inort. Therefore, it is felt that they had descended from a common starting point at a very high altitude. They dispersed further and further apart as they descended They could be seen with the naked eye as greater incandescence resulted from increased friction as they approached closer and closer to the earth through heavier atmospheric density.
 - b. On the basis of the colors of these unknown flying objects:
- (1) The illuminated object must be made up of more than one substance. The light generated as a result of heat from friction was different due to differences in the degree of heat resistance and conductivity, and the difference in the smoothness of the surfaces of the disintegrated bodies during their descent.
- (2) On the basis of the above statement, these unidentified flying objects were probably bodies-fallen satellites or second and third stage rockets that had entered orbits then disintegrated in the earth's atmosphere after they had either encountered a malfunction or had performed their ultimate mission.

Conclusion:

- a. There are numberous unannounced American and Russian space satellites. It is possible that some of them may disintegrate in the earth's atmosphere.
- on July 9, the Kung Shang Joh Pac. Hong Kong, published the following report on its second page: "Washington, July 7 (AFP) The United States announced today that the 29 ton satellite that went into orbit on Tuesday (July 5) had broken into pieces in space on the same day." Therefore, it seems possible that the unidentified flying objects discovered over Taiwan could be some of the broken pieces of the above mentioned 29 ton satellite:"

COMMENT

- 1: The first four sightings list the observer as unknown. The last three sightings list officials (police, military) as observers. This is probably an indirect method to indicate source reliability of qualified vs unqualified rather than known vs unknown.
- The 1800 time of sighting at Kuan-hai may possibly be an even one hour error made either by the observer or by the people who prepared the study. The sightings

TRANSLATION OF WRITTEN NARRATIVE BY J. R. CARLOS

Memorandum Concerning Phenomenon Observed Sunday, 23 April
1967 At Approximately 8:00 P. M.

At approximately the hour indicated above, my wife was watering the flowers in the window boxes of our house; I was near a bedroom window which she had left open. She asked me to close the window and when I approached it I was surprised to see the sky so clear and full of stars. At this moment I noticed a star of surprising magnitude; my surprise was even greater when I observed it was moving from the Southwest to the Northeast. Its size was greater than Venus in its most visible periods. I called to my children and to my wife; they saw the star (as we will call the object) which was moving and had a very intense brilliance, with no change of color, giving off a clear yellow light with uniform rays. We ran out to the fields near our house and I carried binoculars (Zeiss) which are very powerful.

As I leaned on a fence to control my nerves, I called out to my children that I saw a star of a dull red color, without the rays which normally appear around a star; it was moving toward the star which had first interested us. At first I thought it was an optical illusion since the other star was also moving in the same direction, but, on training the binoculars on the red star, I noticed it was increasing in size and therefore must be moving. I called out to my children to look at the second star but found it was not visible to the eye and it was also being covered by a cloud. The two stars rapidly approached each other; both appeared to be at the same altitude or height on horizon but the red star was moving faster. On looking again at the area I could only see the large star which had somewhat changed its direction, moving more to the North. (Larger star is the yellow star.) I realized this change of direction later; I did not stop to think about it at the time but when I was reconstructing my observations I remembered it. I did note at the time that the larger star was moving more rapidly but without losing brilliance, and while I was observing it there was no change of color or any flashes.

The drawing attached shows the larger star at the moment I saw multiple red lines moving from one side to the other, making a kind of zig-zag and, at the end of some of these lines, what appeared to be small rays, completely rectilinear, forming small stars of enormous brilliance. The lines were red and the small stars formed at the end of the lines were of a very brilliant clear red color. At this moment the clouds lifted and my wife could see the multiple lights or stars that formed.

In summary, this phenomenon seemed to come from one object which moved rapidly from one place to another, leaving behind a red line which faded out with a sort of flash; it was not like the explosions of fireworks in which there are a number of rocket flashes at the same time.

I believe that the two objects crashed together but, unfortunately, I let my children use the binoculars and tried to direct their vision toward the two stars; also, the observation took place during some 80 seconds so there was no time. I do know that the larger star was already somewhat out of the zone where I saw the explosions when they appeared. It could be that there was some delay in finding the area when my children returned the binoculars, but when I again located it, it was difficult to find as it was



AGADIR: 13 January (Maghreb Arab Press): There were a few clouds in the sky on last Wednesday and by mere luck, men, women and children had been watching for thirty minutes the coming out of the moon in order to know whether Ramadan was over and to celebrate Aid El Fitr. Suddenly, at 1743 hours, a round luminous object with a fantastic speed and an exceptional brightness like the beams of a powerful searchlight appeared in the space above Agadir.

First, people thought it was a meteorite, and then a Telstar-like satellite. Many thought it was a common shooting star but they had to change their mind as

the sight was turning into real science fiction.

Mr. Juan Dias, a Spaniard and chief of the "Radio maritime of the port of Agadir" department asserts that "it cannot be a shooting star or a satellite which had left its orbit. The object had an impressive volume, four times bigger than that of a star. It was seen two or three seconds before the cannon shots which announced the end of Ramadan. Its course was absolutely fantastic. It lasted three or four seconds. Heanwhile, the luminosity of the mysterious object lighted the whole town in an extraordinary way and then suddenly and probably when it came in touch with the atmosphere it disintegrated more mysteriously. The luminosity which had turned blue became red and finally yellow."

Mr. Dias said that being an extremely interested witness he can assert the

disintegration was not followed by any sound.

"The pieces, if there were any pieces, he added, have completely melted in the atmosphere even before reaching the sea."

objects since 1952. His first sighting was of an object on the ground near Auck-land. In 1956 he observed two UFO's -; six witnesses were present on the first sighting and one on the second. In 1957 he saw one UFO. He saw two near Ohakea (4012S-17523E) in 1965.

3. Later Developments. In September 1963 the Deputy for Technology and Subsystems informed the Attache that Capt Cathie had no basis for his beliefs. (See enclosure #2). On 19 October 1965 Cathie telephoned from Auckland and stated that he could prove mathmatecally that an aerial (Antenna) was located at Santa Cruz, Lat 167 Long 12. He claimed that he could show a relationship between the 1908 Siberian explosion and the magnetic compass variations which existed at the Santa Cruz Islands in the South Pacific. Also, just prior to this contact, Cathie indicated his intention to publish the information he had collected. (See enclosure #3). In December 1965 the Air Attache, Wellington, forwarded additional information to AFSC (FTD). (See enclosure #4). Again on 23 February 1966, additional findings and calculations were forwarded to AFSC (FTD). (See enclosure #5). Finally, on 10 August 1966 the Attache dispatched more calculations provided by Capt Cathie. (See enclosure #6).

4. Recent Events. Capt Cathie again contacted the Air Attache office about a month after the writer had arrived for duty. This was in the second week of March 1967. He was advised that if he had additional information he could submit it for evaluation. On 14 April 1967, he sent a letter outlining some of his theories. including a diagram and certain mathmatical computations. In addition he attached a penned note to report another UFO sighting by two pilots of the NAC organization, a Capt H. Findlater and First Officer Watts. (See enclosure #7). After some more conversation, Capt Cathie asked if the writer would meet him in the Office of a book publisher to discuss his contemplated book, "Harmonic-33". This meeting was held in the offices of A. H. & A. W. Reed, Publishers, 182 Wakefield Street, Wellington, N.Z. During this meeting, the publisher and Capt Cathie's editor, (a Mr. Smith) discussed the theory Cathie has developed. The book is now about 6 months short of publication. Thile in this meeting Cathie made the statement that he could predict the time of the French Atomic Tests at MURUROA Island, based on his mathmatical calculations provided he could get reasonably accurate figures upon which to base his computations. The publisher, editor and the writer all expressed amazement but Cathie was firm in his statement. He was asked to present his comments in writing which he has done. (See enclosure #8).

COMMENT: This man is not a typical "UFO NUT". At one time his employer, NAC, apparently thought he was a little "off" on the subject, but now offers no objection to his work in the field. He has no ax to grind or special interests other than to prove his theories. When asked if he had placed any of his calculations into a computer for verification, he stated that he had only used an ordinary office calculater. The central theme of his book "Harmonic-33" will tend to show that some intelligent force from outer space is replotting a world grid which probably existed cons ago. He alleges that these "beings" are harmless but that they are following a pattern which he is only now beginning to prove. His theory that atomic explosions to be successful must follow a precise time and mathmatical pattern is beyond comment. However if the forthcoming French tests fall into such a pattern then further investigation may be in order. During Cathle's several conversations with the writer he mentioned several times his belief that the strange object photographed by the USNS ELTANIN, 1965-1966 geodetic survey vessel, was actually an antenna placed on the sea floor by the outer space "beings". He further alleges that these antennas are located in other parts of the world, some of them several miles below the earth's surface. When "Harmonic-33" is published a copy will be forwarded with a reference to this report.

During the last two years, I have made on intensive study of the "Saucer Phenomena", and sincerely believe that I now have sufficient mathematical and geometric proof to show that these "vehicles" are actively engaged in re-constructing a navigational type grid system over the surface of the whole world.

Op until now, I have passed on some pieces of information to the American Embassy, but realise that I cannot prove my case until all the data I have discovered, has been assessed as a unit. I am, at the moment, compiling all the evidence I have into book form and this will be published sometime late 1967.

I believe my throries to be correct because of the following reasons:

- (1) Once I had found the grometric pattern of the grid structure, I broke the polar sections down into mathematical co-ordinates and found that the values were directly connected with, speed of light mass gravity acceleration.
- (2) The mathematical geometrics of the grid structure can also be connected directly with atom bomb tests. I have found that the same geometrics apply and that atomic explosions have to be carried out on geometric positions on the earth's surface. Also that due to the special geometric harmonics required to disrupt an atom, the sum has to be at certain latitudes in order for an emplosion to take place. In fact, I now believe that the sun actually triggers the bomb when it passes through a certain geometric position in relation to earth.

To check my theory, I used the sories of atomic tests carried out by the French at Mururoa Island in the Facific.

It the time of each explosion, the sun was found to be at a particular distance, in minutes of arc, north of the latitude of Mururoa Island. These distances co-incided exactly with the co-ordinates I had derived from the U.F.C. grid system which to me, proves it must exist.

I also found that the distances in minutes of arc from Eururea Island to both the American Scientific Base at Blenheim, N.Z., and also the aerial type object photographed by the "Eltanin" off the coast of South America, is 2640. This figure, I have found in the grid structure, to be the connecting harmonic

Possibly some of this series will be tried egain in the next tests, but more than possibly, they will attempt to get results with different combinations of the formulae.

Dear Sir,

First of all, I would like to thank you for your offer of co-operation to help solve the puzzle of the U.F.C. activities. It's quite a change to find someone who will listen with an open mind, after two years of battling for a hearing.

"At eleven o'clock, our eyes fell upon the walls and columns of B aalbeck, a notable ruin, whose history is a scaled hook. One thing is sure though, such grandeur of design and such grace of execution as one sees in the temples of Baalbock, have not been equalled or even approached by any other work of man's hands that has ever been built within the last twenty centuries.

This great temple of the Sun, the temple of Jupiter, and the several smaller

temples are clustered together in the midst of these Syrian villages miserably dirty. —— these temples are built upon massive substructures that might support a world almost. The material used is blocks of stone as large as an omnibus, very few of them are smaller than a carpenter's tool chest. These structures are traversed by tunnels of masonry through which a train of cars might pass. ————

The temple of the Sum is nearly 300 feet long and 160 feet wide. It has 54 columns around it, but only six are standing now —— these columns and their entablatures together are 90 feet high, a prodigious altitude for shafts of stone to reach —— the p illars are eight feet thick and with them lie beautiful capitals apparently as large as a small cottage, and also single slabe of stone superbly sculptured, that are four or five feet thick and would completely cover the floor of any ordinary parlor —— and yet these sculptured blocks are trifles in size compared with the rough-hown stones that form the wide verendah, or platform which surrounds the great temple. One stretch of that platform composed of only three stones, is nearly 300 feet in length. They are thirteen feet square, two of them are each 64 feet, and a third, 69 feet long. They are built into the massive wall 20 feet above the greand.

We went to the quarry from whence these stones of B salbeck were taken. It was a quarter of a mile off, downhill. In a pit, lay the mate of the largest stone. It lay there just as the giants of old forgotten time left it when they were called hence. — this enormous block lies there squared and ready for the builders' hands, a solid heas 14 feet by 17 feet wide and 70 feet long."

As you see from that short extract, the buildings in some of these ancient cities, are constructed from such massive blocks of stone that even with the help of modern science, it would be a difficult and costly operation to shift them even a few feet.

If we assume that this grid system was used in the past to create frequencies the which would nulify normal gravity, then it could have been used both for transport that for lifting great weights.

I could then construct the grid pattern on this more accurately than is possible on maps. I could also obtain more data on a globe such as this, then I can trying to plot positions on maps.

Causó Impresión el Informe Secreto

HA causado viva impresión en nues-tro medio el informe secreto de la Aerial Phenomena Research Organization (Organización para el Estudio de los Fenómenos Aéreos), publicado ayer por LA RAZON, scerca de las nuevas apariciones de OVNI en el hemisterio Sur, especialmente en Argentina y Chile. Como se recordará, em docu-mento formula todo un proceso sobre la actividad cumplida en Estados Unidos en esta materia, al mismo tiempo que revela detalles desconocidos del tratamiento que esta novedad contemporánea ha merecido, no solo en el manejo clentifico del asunto, sino tambien en la forma en que se ha venido presentando la información al público scerca de ellos, incluidas sus implicancias de tipo militar y sun diplomático. El Informe comienza por establecer que, por lo menos a partir de 1947, todo lo que se relacionara con OVNI en Estados Unidos apenas fue considerado como un amable pasatlempo de sonadores. La generalidad de los cientificos no prestaba gran atención a estos fenómenos y, al menos aparentemente, los militares tampoco. Sin embargo, la situación habria de conmoverse hacia marzo de 1966, cuando el secretario de Estado, Harold Brown, decidió apariguar la opinión pública. decidió apaciguar la opinión públicaalterada por observaciones de OVNI invitando a las expertos que trabajaban en el proyecto Blue lionk a concurrir a una romisión del Senado. Ante el estupor general, el profesor J. Hallen Hynek (consultor del mencionado proyecto) proclamo alli su des-acuerdo con el informe militar, afir-mando que los comunicados de la fuerma aérea no reflejaban la realidad. Agregaba que la cuestión no era ma-teria que dependiera de militares, sino que se trataba de una estricta cuestión cientifica en la que su conciencia le impedia aparecer como rechazando un hecho nuevo de la mayor importancia y en cuya investigación venía traba-jando desde hacia 18 años. Establecida una aspera polémica entre el mayor Hector Quintanilla -que dirigia el Proyeato- y el profesor Hynek, el asunto

Ablertos de esta manera los archivos secretos a todo científico deseoso de controlar lo realizado, poco más tarde presentose el profesor James Mac Donald, de la universidad de Arizona, dispuesto a investigar los antecedentes recopliados. Asl pudo descubrir y revelar que el famoso jury Robertson, de 1953, presentado como compuesto por sablos, no había sido en realidad más que un instru-mento de la CIA (servicio de inteligencia), orientado a servir una conclusión que Hynek se había negado a suscribir: Los OVNI no existen y hay que edu-car al público, para que tenga la reflexion debida solo para ver globos son-das, bólidos, etcétera". Un examen profundo de los casos estudiados por Mao Donald demostraron que el objeto evidente del proyecto era no analizar las observaciones, sino convencer a los testigos de que no habían visto nada y persuadir al público que todo era una fantasia. Estupefacto anto este descu-brimiento, Mac Donald (originalmente no interesado en los OVNI, puesto que era especialista en fisica atmosférica), realizó numerosos apuntes y solicito fotocopias, que terminaron con una nereso a los documentos por otros cientifiintenté encumendar la tarca a alguna universidad, que no obtuvo a pesar del ofrecimiento de 500 mil délaces, centralizandose la expectativa general en la comisión civil, cuya dirección fue conflada al profesor Edward Condon. Este organismo, sin embargo, no fue integrado con especialistas sino con un equipo de naicologos, a cuyo cargo es-Academia de Ciencias, en sellembre venidero, y luego al Congreso de Estados Unidos. Obvismente, se considera que un documento elaborado sin meteorologistax, especialistas en radar, etc.; puede insistir en que todo es consecuencla de un fenómeno psicológico en bloque, conclusión que en medias cientificos se ataca denunciando que jamás se

en lugares donde se apreció la apari-ción de un OVNI, mientras que menudea en exos sitios la presencia de agen-tes de la CIA, el FBI o la Fuerza Aérea. Paradolicamente, y al margen del ni-vel mundial alcanzado por este proble-ma, la cuestión de los OVNI obtuvo repercusiones singulares en la Unión Soviética. Un insolito articulo aparecido en la revista rusa "Joven Técnica" por el soviético Kazantsen y el francés Valles comenta un caso de observación sobre una base norteamericana de cohetes, en el estado de Dakota del Nor-te. Esa publicación se ha interpretado como proveedors de la clave para en-tender la actitud de la CIA y de los servicios secretos de otros países, que nego durante 20 años la existencia poblica de los OVNI. Esz clave estaria dada por la renuencia a reconocer la existencia de un fenómeno natural o no, cuyo control daria superioridad militar aplastante a quien la poseyera. Concretamente, la observación a que se reflere la publicación se habria regis-trado el 25 de agosto de 1968, cuando un objeto luminoso fue detectado por los radares bajando y elevándose rápidamente sobre una base deade la cual. en cualquier momento, podrian dispa-rarse cohetes atómicos intercontinenta-les sobre la Unión Soviética. El informe finaliza sensiando que a comienzos de 1968, la situación de los OVNI se caracterizaba por los hechos siguiencontrolar el problema, contra los cientificos que desean intervenir decisivamente; existe interés en desardmar a los investigadores y mantener ignoran-te al público y aun al propio Congreso extadounidense; se quiere acaliar testigos. En el frente espontaneamente abler-to por los científicos particulares, se hace notar que muchos quedaron en el camino por innumerables inconvenien-tes, ocultaciones, simulaciones y sor-prendentes demmentidas, pero va de suyo que muchos otros persisten y se em-pecinan por develar este misterio moderno que, por momentos, cobra magnitud y reune testimonios en el mejor de los casos de ninguna manera desde-

On 020326L Dec, GCA nd MTI radar reported Bogie 8NM southwest of NKP moving at same speed as nife 28, night Recce chopper, at 120 knots. Knife 28 dispatched to area, but CA lost Bogie when Knife 28 approached to within 2-3NM. GCA later lost Knife 8 at same spot when Knife descended below 1100 feet altitude. Knife 28 pproached target without lights, then employed searchlight, but observed othing. Moon reportedly had gone down and conditions were too dark to see well s Knife 28 returned to base, GCA picked up Bogie again 1NM southeast of where t had disappeared, heading southeast. GCA lost it after 4-5NM, still heading outheast in vicinity of VD 5891. Part II. On 6 December, 606 SOS advisor to Thai Border Patrol Police (HPP), Region IV, reported that HPP had begun peration on 28 November between NKP and Sakhon Nakhon towns in same proximity s above sighting northwest of NKP. Four to six BPP and Royal Thai Army (RTA) elicopters were involved in this operation. In addition, RPP Region IV posses me white heur helicopter, which is used to monitor BPP operations. Historically, That pilots have been reluctant to fly at night, but the moon in recent days as made night flying almost as easy as daytime operations, and Thai pilots lave been known to accomplish night flights in areas where terrain is well-known them. As in the past, chopper operations by RTA and RPP are mostly local in sture and no flight plans are filed for resupply, placement of units, or moniforing activities unless proper pressure is brought to bear. Many BPP/RTA perations against communist terrorist are autonomous in nature, and thus sentralized control is weak. As result, air defense surveillance system is often not informed of flights until later-if at all. RPP advisor is attempting to secure time so flights in support of above operation, including dates, and tanding areas. Part III. Historically, November and early December have produced large numbers of radar returns, particularly on GCA scopes, from natural or cultural phenomena in THAILAND. These include temperature inversions, calloons from fairs and religious celebrations, migratory birds, and kites. In November 1967, HQ 7/13AF DI and DO ran experiment at Udorn when GCA scopes were reporting more than 15 low/slow returns in vicinity of Udorn RTAFB. Group observers phaically sighted scores of balloons, three flocks of migratory birds, several kites, plus at least four local choppers in a span of ten minutes. At same time these sightings, even of legitimate friendly flights, failed to porrelate with Brigham (Udorn RTAFB-based GCI radar) and GCA returns. On numberous occassions it was established that phenomena, which U.S. personnel in GCI site would not report as authentic traffic, was reported into ACC and air defense system by Thai operators. U.S. personnel attributed these to propagation anomalies. Further investigation attributed a number of sporadic returns to over-the-horizon signals distorted by weather conditions.

To date, there is no confirmed evidence that hostile aircraft or helicopters have penetrated Thai air space in support of insurgent or communist activities. Though it is possible that illicit ffriendly flights for purposes of private gain, pleasure, smuggling are being conducted, there is no evidence to substantiate this possibility at present time. It is suspected that Lao and Thai Air Force officers can and do employ RLAF and RTAF aircraft in private ventures or travel without filing proper flight plans for informing components of the air defense surveillance system. Part IV. Nature of recent reported sightings follows same pattern as "unknown returns" reported last year by Ubon and Udorn. In analysis of possible hostile penetration of THAILAND and in support of insurgent forces, preliminary study was conducted of technical aspects of such flights. It was found that to land in remote jungle olearings at night to airlift personnel or provide resupply was highly dangerous and improbable, especially in absence of sophisticated navigation and landing aids, and was beyond technical capability of U.S. air crews. Further, study of Air Order of Battle of nearby communist or neutral countries indicates that available helicopter strength is such that hostile or unfriendly forces do not possess adequate numbers of low/slow aircraft to undertake such missions with accompanying risk factor, when they are unable to support their own field





It is not likely, therefore, that they would rike valuable aircraft and crows to support That insurgent, when resupply, infiltration, and movement by other means is cheaper, safer, and less obvious. It is interesting to note that such unknown returns have been reported since 1965 and yet no unidentified aircraft has ever crashed or been physically observed so it could be identified. Friendly suppression forces have never shot down or hit these unknown intruders, whereas U.S. helicopters and aircraft in VIETNAM and LAOS have suffered many hits and losses, and as indicated in Part I, friendly aircraft in area could not observe, even with aid of lights, my other aircraft. In past, when Royal Thai Government offered 200,000 Baht reward for shooting down of unknown aircraft and helicopters, only aircraft ever nit were BPP or RTA choppers and USAF aircraft on legitimate missions. As result, Thai Government has since withdrawn reward offer since no hostile mircraft or "unknowns" were ever downed. It is also interesting to note that in 1967 unidentified aircraft activity, purportedly in support of communist insurgents, seemed to preoccupy That officials until U.S. resources provided lawk anti-aircraft missiles. Then in speech of acceptance and thanks, General PHRAPHAT, Deputy Prime Minister, said helicopter threat from outside THAILAND and ended or come under control. Part V. This headquarters is highly interested in such sightings and reports, and will continue to monitor such activity for signs of hostile intent. However, there is no evidence at procent time to indicate rash of recont "Bogies" reported near MKP RTAFB involves nostile or unfriendly activity. Unquote.

- The following is quoted from a COMUSMACTHAI message dated 17 December 1968. The message was to CINCPAC with information to 7/13AF and referenced the message quoted above. Quote. "This headquarters considers the message and excellent assessment of unidentified helicopter reports in THAILAND. This evaluation parallels our own assessments." Unquote.
- The most recent reported sightings occurred in South LAOS. On the nights of 14, 16 and 18 December 1968, an unidentified high wing single engine airpraft was observed over Ban Thateng (1526N-10622E), LAOS. On two occasions it was reported circling at low altitude (400 feet). On the third occasion, it was observed at 6000 feet heading west. Estimated speed 100 knots. It has not been determined if the aircraft was an unreported friendly or enemy.
- COMMENTS: AIRA concurs with the comments and assessments made and with the conclusion which are drawn. It seems highly unlikely the enemy would take the risks involved to infiltrate personnel or supplies when, as is pointed nut, other methods are cheaper, safer and less obvious. Some of the "unknowns" lave been reported far enough into THAILAND that large helicopters would have to be used or refuclings made by small helicopters. In order to reach some of these locations, long flights would have to be made over friendly territory, both in LACS and THAILAND. Again this seems rather unlikely and has not been confirmed by any sightings. There are no known enemy hold staging areas or bases in LACS from which such flights could operate within reasonable range, safety and security and yet remain such a well kept secret for such a long period of time. If any of these flights are, in fact, occuring it appears such more reasonable that they might be unreported friendly activities.





- 2. Details of provisions for compensating damages, if any, caused to personnel and/or property by such bodies outlisde the U.S.A.









DETAILS OF STRUCTURE OF WRECKAGE FOUND IN KOTA DISTRICT

- 1. During a trip rade by the Army Attache to Fairabad on 21-23 September, Privadior Senoral Attal Latif Khan, Cornander of the 25th Laintry (Taisabad) Privade Group on 22 September described reports received by him from gendarate troops in the Jekhan Corrilor of a "flying object" observed about 12 August 1955 flying south of but meer the Seviet-Afghan border from west to east. The "object" was allegedly observed by ratives in the vicinity of ISHMASHIM (71935'E,35°60'N) and Cala Panja (72°35'E,37°00'N) and by other ratives in unidentified villages between these points. General Latif stated that "more than one-thousand" tribesmen and villagers have reported having observed this object.
- 2. The "object" was described by natives who saw it as being a battleshaped cyclimier stout four notors long by one and one-half to two meters wide at
 the base and with a flare at the top about one and one-half raters long. I black
 band is alleged to have been printed around the center of the cyclimier, the
 bottom half of the cyclimian was blue and the top half was variously reported as
 being red or yellow. General Latif drew a sketch of the "object" as reported
 and it is enclosed with this report.
- 3. The "object" was reported to be travelling at a "fast" rate of speed from four to five kilometers high and with a "hissing sound". Only one such object was allegedly seen. The General had no other details but is attempting to gather additional information.
- h. On 21 September, the Arry 'ttache talked to a retired Afrhan Army Officer who had just returned from a trip across country to SHTA LAGE(71°15'E,37°20'H) thence north to CHA: HOD (71°30'E,37°45'H) and return. (See our EC-55-55). This officer reported hearing reports from natives in the wicinity of CALA BAR PANUA [71°30'E,37°33'N) of a "flying object" observed flying east in early September. The natives could describe the object only as being "round with a flema on top" and could provide no other details.

COMMENT:

- 1. Most Afghans, especially tribesmon and villagers, have a very poor sense of distance and measurements and estimates in this report are probably highly inaccurate.
- 2. It is the tempt Attache's opinion that the retired Army Officer referred to the our NC-55-59 will probably attempt to gain additional information on his trip through the akkeen Carridor concerning these "flying objects" reports, Wa will be questioned on his return concerning such information.



At approximately 0033 hours, 24 August 1969, the pilot of a fixedwing, light observation aircraft (OV-10) observed an unidentified object on the ground approximately five miles north-northeast of Nakhon Phanom RTAFB. At the time, the pilot was searching for unidentified flying objects pursuant to in earlier Base Command Post request made while the OV-10 was on final approach for landing. The aircraft orbitted the sighting area, and the pilot observed dut he thought to be a large, omni-directional light on a stretch of road.)n his next pass, the pilot sighted 15-25 individuals gathered around a 'lattice structure", which he said could have been a helicopter with its. otor blades folded. He next observed the object being moved into trees djacent to the road. The pilot vectored the area and pin-pointed the ocation as VE 652280. USAF Security Police representatives subsequently idvised that a sweep of the sighting area, from Ban Na Mun Hin (VE 668235) to the vicinity of Ban Ram Rat (VE 641280), by Royal Thai Army (RTA) personnel between 0100 and 0400 hours, 24 August 1969 produced no results, nor did a joint RTA-USAF Security Police search at 1100 hours the same day. (OSI Evaluation re helicopter sighting: F-5).

3. 5106-ASP-6J reported that on the night of 23-24 August 1969, some. Eventy Thai National residents of Ban Sang Hin (VE 682249) reportedly travelled to and from the Wat Si Sa-at, located in Ban Ram Rat (VE 641280), to take an offering. This religious procession followed the country road to Ban lam Rat, passing through Ban Nong Bua (VE 668265) and Ban Khok Sawang (VE 57278). On their return trip, between Bun Nong Bua and Ban Sang Hin, members of the group noticed an aircraft circling overhead. One of the villagers, who was carrying a portable electric lantern to light their path, shined his light input at the plane. Source (5106-ASP-6J) stated that this incident occurred sometime between 2400 hours 23 August and 0100 hours 24 August 1969. (F-3).

4. In an effort to obtain further details, 5106-ASP-6, supra, travelled to Ban Sang Hin, where he questioned a villager (NFI) who allegedly took part in the pilgrimage to Wat Si Sa-at. This villager confirmed the information received from 5106-ASP-6J, and provided the following additional details:

a. The religious procession left Ban Sang Hin at approximately 2000 hours, 23 August 1969, arrived at the wat two hours later, and departed for home again at 2330 hours. Enroute, the villagers travelled along the country road more or less in a single file. Some carried flashlights to light the way, and at least one villager carried a powerful electric lantern. On the return trip, the pilgrims carried with them two large ceremonial drums. Due to the weight of the drums, they were suspended between two long poles, with several persons supporting each pole. (F-3).

Sang Hin, members of the group observed an aircraft circling overhead, and the villager with the electric lantern directed its beam at the plane. When the plane continued to circle, and began to come lower, some members of the group became frightened and ran into the woods along the road. After the aircraft left the area, the group continued on its way, arriving at Ban Sang Hin between Oloo and Oloo hours, 24 August 1969. (F-3). (See attached sketch).

COMMENTS OF THE APPROVING OFFICER: The information in paragraphs 3 and 4 above, was furnished the Commander and Director of Intelligence, 56th Special Operations Wing and 56th Security Police Squadron, Nakhon Phanom RTAFB, upon receipt.



rotor blades" was probably no more that the poles supporting large ceremonial lrums. The location pinpointed by the OV-10 pilot is little more than a mile from a line between Ban Nong Bua and Ban Sang Hin, and such an error would not be unreasonable considering the sighting was made from a moving observation point at night. Further, the possibility exists that RTA personnel, searching for the ground object originally reported, may have come across information pointing to the religious procession, but failed to report it.

Radar and visual sightings of UFOs, such as that being checked out by the OV-10 pilot in this instance, are not a new phenomenon, particularly at night. A January 1969 report lists seven UFO sightings at Nakhon Phanom RTAFB for the period 28 November 1968 to 1 January 1969 alone. Attempts by base reconnaissance aircraft to further identify the objects were unsuccessful. Noting these unresolved reports, the 7/13th Air Force Director of Intelligence offered several comments and possible explanations:

- a. On 28 November 1968, the Thai Border Patrol Police (BPP) began an operation involving four to six BPP and Royal Thai Army (RTA) helicopters, in the vicinity of some of the sightings northwest of the base. While Thai pilots had historically been reluctant to fly at night, a recent full moon had made night flying almost as easy as daytime operations, and pilots of both the BPP and RTA had been known to accomplish night flights. Centralized control of these agencies' autonomous counter-insurgency operations is weak, however, and Thai units frequently filed flights plans with the Air Defense Surveillance System only after the fact, if at all.
- b. Alternatively, the UFOs sighted might have been aircraft on clandestine flights by US agencies, as such flights are often completed without details being released to traffic control offices. Though it is possible that the illicit flights were friendly, for purposes of privategain, pleasure or smuggling, there was no evidence at the time to substantiate that possibility.
- c. During November and early December, radar gear in Thailand, particularly Ground Controlled Approach (GCA) scopes, have historically yielded large numbers of returns from natural or cultural phenomena, e.g., temperature inversions, balloons from fairs and religious celebrations, migratory birds, and kites. In November 1967, Headquarters 7/13th Air Force conducted an experiment at Udorn RTAFB, where GCA scopes were reporting more than fifteen unidentified returns. In a span of ten minutes, human observers physically sighted scores of balloons, three flocks of migratory birds, several kites, plus at least four local helicopters. These sighting, even of friendly flights, could not be correlated with GCA and other electronic returns.
- d. In analysing the threat of helicopters penetrating Thailand or supporting insurgent forces, a preliminary study of the technical factors involved determined that landing helicopters in remote jungle clearings at night to airlift personnel or material was highly dangerous, particularly without sophisticated navigational and landing aids. Additionally, the nearby Communist or neutral countries from which the helicopters might come do not presently possess adequate numbers of low/slow aircraft to support their own field forces, officials or units by air, without considering any high risk extra-territorial missions.
- e. In 1967, unidentified aircraft activity, purportedly in support of Communist insurgents inside Thailand, seemed to preoccupy Thai officials until U.S. resources provided Hawk anti-aircraft missiles. Then, in a speech of acceptance and thanks, General PHRAPHAT, Deputy Prime Minister, said the helicopter threat from outside Thailand had ended or come under control.

It would not seem necessary for insurgents to use helicopters for crossing nto Thailand. Evidence indicates that much of the Thai-Lactian border can se crossed at ground level without a great deal of difficulty, affording a 'ar cheaper, safer and less obvious means of infiltration or exfiltration. et Thai military and police agencies continue to report helicopter sightings, r fail to report conflicting information which might derogate claims of helicopter activity. This phenomenon may reflect the fact that the presence of elicopters would be evidence of "externally supported aggression," and provide an explanation of Thailand's insurgent movement which fortuitously mits any possibility of an internal cause. A recent self-analysis by the 'hai government Communist-suppression agency in mid-South Thailand provides a totably perceptive insight into a facet of Thai personality which affects idditionally the gathering and validity of intelligence information from the field. The report cautions government officials against their prevalent attitude that no report of insurgent activity is sufficiently important to send forward unless it has been bulwarked with references to unidentified support helicopters, transceivers and AK rifles, or the presence of some 'amous guerilla leader.2



A day or two after the TV program, the Reuters correspondent went to see General STROLYAROV. The General was very polite, confirmed the information about the commission, the 18 astronomers and SAF efficers and the 200 observers. In addition, he said five (5) positive sightings had been made.

Approximately a week later the Reuters correspondent went back to see General STROLYAROV. However, this time the correspondent could not get past the General's secretary; was politely but firmly told the General was no longer available for interview.

5. On 12 December 1967, the British Embassy was directed by London to further investigate the subject with a view to cooperating with the Russians in observation teams for UFOs.

The Scientific Counselor of the British Embassy went to the State Committee for Science and Technology and inquired about the UFO Commission and the possibility of British-Russian cooperation in observation of UFOs. The British Counselor was politely received and the commission was freely discussed. The British were told they would receive a reply to their request about cooperation.


The British did not receive an answer and did not pursue the subject. However, on 8 January 1968 while on a routine visit to the Soviet State Committee for Science and Technology, the British Scientific Counselor was told the following: The commission for investigating UFOs had been set up in response to a popular demand. The commission had met twice, but since there was insufficient information to sustain it the commission would be disbanded after the next meeting.

8. The British Scientific Counselor believes the original announcement of the work of the commission on TV was an oversight on the part of the censors because the commission has not been reported or referred to anywhere else. He believes the commission has not been disbanded, but will continue under cover. This information was sent to London.

COMMENT:

The preceding information was given to RO by source. RO also read confidentidal British files on this subject. RO did not approach Reuters correspondent because of delicate position of source. RO was unable to find anyone in Moscow who saw TV program or read article in UK press.

2. On 10 or 11 November 1967 the U.S. Science Attache received a telephone call from the Reuters correspondent and was asked if he had seen the TV program. When the Science Attache replied that he had not seen the program, the correspondent described it and asked the Science Attache if he thought the information was worth reporting. The Science Attache said yes. The Science Attache, like the RO, has not seen the UK press report. The U.S. Science Attache will receive two copies of this report and will forward one copy to the appropriate S & T Agency in Washington.

THE FERRET FLEETS

Blandly classified as an "environmental research" vessel, the U.S.S. Pueblo is actually one of more than 80 immensely sophisticated BLINT (for electronic intelligence) ships in the U.S. Navy. That ferret fleet is intended as a counterforce to Russia's 60-vessel ELINT armada, made up mostly of converted trawlers and hydrographic craft, all bristling with antennas and sensitive snooping gear. Just as the Pueblo and her kin prowl the international waters off China, North Korea and the Soviet Union, Russian trawiers are stationed off California, South Carolina, Florida's Cape Kennedy, Guam and Alaska. A Soviet spy ship does every move of U.S. aircraft carriers on "Yankee Station," the 45,000-eq.-mi. area of the Tonkin Gulf from which American air strikes over North Viet Nam originate, flashing alerts to Hanoi, Other Russian ELINT ships shadow the U.S. Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean.

A main mission for both ELINT fleets is the systematic collection and classification of submarine "signatures"—the distinctive electronic blend of propeller and engine noises, wake turbulence and magnetic fields generated by each individual sub. Thanks to Pueblo & Co., the Navy has nearly completed a computer-taped "library" classifying Russia's 450 or more subs, from diesel-powered Whiskey-class boats to the new, nuclear Juliett class. In the near future, U.S. naval commanders will be able to draw instant digital readouts that will identify any Soviet sub they can hear.

Pueblo's unprepossessing, 179-ft-long hull is fitted out with the latest in so-phisticated ELINT equipment—globe-girdling single-side-band radio, hyperaccurate radars, sonars and navigation instruments. Another primary aim of

the "spook ships"—espionage satellites like Samos and spy planes like the U-2 -is to be "painted" or "illuminated" by enemy radar, whose beams fall on the ship's sensitive receivers. Those signals are taped and sent back to Washington for detailed analysis. By charting radar pulse repetition rates and frequencies, intelligence officers can identify the electronic signalings of known radar systems and thus roughly determine enemy dispositions, while radio traffic analysis provides information on troop buildups or movements and even the names of enemy commanders. Such data also permit the development of jamming programs.

Pueblo employed the twin antennas mounted forward of the wheelhouse. Domelike direction finders and "troposcattering" sensors (which can "read" signals bouncing from the troposphere) are mounted on the foremast to an-

alyze those signals and to eavesdrop on radio communications. The ship is equipped to test salinity levels, temperatures and algae growth in various parts of the Sea of Japan—all valuable information for sonar operators. Pentagon photos of Pueblo taken after the ship's renovation in Bremerton, Wash, show advanced low-frequency antennas that would permit the ship to communicate with U.S. nuclear subs to a depth of about 100 feet.


Photographs cannot show Pueblo's most sensitive gear, which is below the water line. From keel to boot topping, the hull bulges with sonar domes; hydrophones, subsurface antennas, and possibly a "giant ear" like that used on the larger U.S.S. Liberty, which was shot up by the Israelis in the Mediterranean last summer. Pueblo is also rigged to tow hundreds of yards of hydrophone cable with which to hear submarines as much as 75 miles away.

Captain Cathie was asked if official reports were submitted on these sightings, and he said no, that Civil Aviation personnel had been warned not to report any more of these observations. Captain Cathie was advised to submit any additional information he might have. He did, under cover of his letter of 18 January 1968 (attachment No. 1).

- Pueblo Incident: On 8 February 1968 a second letter with attachments was received from Cathie (attachment No. 2). This effort by Cathie indicates that he is spending an enormous amount of time and effort trying to prove his theory that an overall master plan exists by an alien race purpose not defined.
- 3. Comments: Captain Cathie is a lean, wiry New Zealander, with an apparently above average knowledge of mathematics. He has seen several UFO's which he stated could not have been aircraft in the accepted sense. He is intensely sincere in his efforts and has convinced a publisher well enough to invest in his book. He stated that Neville Spearman, Publishers (England) were in the final stages of his book. Several thousand copies are to be released in England, New Zealand and the United States.



During 13 to 14 minutes this strange object followed us. It gave me the impression that when it located us it tried to identify us. At once we requested information from the Flight Control Tower in Arica and Iquique. We were informed that no other flights had been scheduled in that zone. Then I told them what we were watching.'

"The pilot of the DC-6B LAN Flight #904 is Chief of Flight Operations. He has been a LAN pilot for eleven years.

"I have never had a similar experience. I didn't believe in "them". It was not an optical vision due to atmospherical reflections. I am sure it was a mechanical apparatus. The plane was flying at an altitude of 8,500 feet, at a speed of 500 kms. The night was cloudy and without stars. I was not the only one who saw this strange object, the co-pilot, the engineer, hostess and steward also saw it. It emitted a light of an intense color, then changed and turned to radiant white. It was suspended at a distance of about 3 kms. from us, in a straight line--it was more or less 2130 hours. Suddenly the same way it appeared it withdrew at an incredible speed, without leaving any track.

"Pilot Marcelo Cisternas was interviewed by La Nación when he arrived, and then called urgently to the LAN Vice President's Office."

Comments: Many sightings have been reported in the northern area of Chile. Personal conversation with the Chilean Air Force Wing Commender at Antofagasta reveals that none of the Chilean Air Force personnel in that area have been fortunate enough to eateh sight of one.

- b. About one week later another strange object appeared for about 10 minutes between 2230 and 2300 local hours. This object however was white and bluish white in appearance and had 4 or 5 appendages (rays of light) which at various times traversed over a nearby lake and around a small mountain at speeds in excess of those which could be expected of an aircraft.
- c. On 19 June there was a re-occurrence of b. for about 5 minutes between 2230 and 2300 hours local. NOTE THE 19 JUNE DATE.
- 2. The 4 July 1965 edition of Diario Illustrado, Santiago newspaper contained the following:

"Nine members of the base Pedro Aquirre Cerda observed the apparition of a curious celestial body while doing routine meteorological observations for a period of 20 minutes. They followed its maneuvers noting its white luminosity at an angle of 450 seen in the southwest of Decepcion Island moving northeast-southeast at high speed on an oscillating course. The radiogram adds:

'On the 5th Chileans communicated with the English Base--British informed that the day before at 1945 five members of that base saw celestial object in the north moving on a zig-zag course and later stopping from 5-10 minutes, then disappearing at great altitude. It was red, then yellowish, then changing to a green color. The angle was estimated at 200 and of the size of a star of the first magnitude.'

"Communique from Argentine Detachment on Decepcion Island between 1942 and 2044 hours said that 16 persons, among them three Chileans, observed a celestial object in the north of the island going north--northeast at very slow speed with an oscillating course and of changing yellow, green and orange color, leaving a tail at an elevation of 300 of lenticular shape disappearing at altitude in cirrus clouds and whose trajectory was followed by theodolite and powerful field glasses. Corporal Uladislao Duran Martinez who was with the detachment took 10 dispositive pictures in color through the Theodolite and field glasses.

"Same day. Detachment Orcadas of Argentina at 1703 hours. Two meteorological observers saw a celestial object moving at very high speed during a period of 15 seconds with a parabolic trajectory moving from east to west with luminous white color which caused magnetic changes in their geo-magnetic instruments, registering changes notably out of the normal. Between the base mentioned no previous communication existed that could induce a group phychosis of that type of observation—which fact is estimated to be of great interest to interested scientific organizations."

3. The 7 July 1965 edition of El Mercurio, Santiago newspaper carried the following:

"Eighteen days ago, the base Pedro Aquirre Cerda announced that at 1600 hours on the 18th of June all the personnel of this base saw celestial body of intense luminosity—a star of the first magnitude. It appeared in the east of Decepcion Island at an elevation of 600 making a turn of 1800 to the left and continued on an eastern course. The object previously made a turn to the right heading in a southernly direction. This phenomenon was seen for a period of 40 minutes—meteorological conditions clear, but dark. Strong winds prevented mounting photographic equipment. On Saturday a similar body was seen at a lower altitude of 450. It passed at high velocity and was seen for 20 minutes. At this time it was seen by Chilean, Argentine and British bases in the Anarctic.

"The Commander of the Base (Pedro Aquirre Cerda) of the Chilean Air Force, Mario Jahn Barrera explained the phenomenon seen by the members of his base. They saw an object moving at tremendous speeds giving off a blue-green light which caused interference (electro-magnetic) in meteorological equipment

located in the Argentine base directly in front of our location.

"This is the second time in less than a month that we have observed these celestial bodies. The first was on the 13th of June and the last this Saturday at 1920 hours. It was during this last observation when all our group saw this phenomenon while making atmospheric observations. The color of the body was red yellowish changing to green to yellow and to orange. It was at a short distance at an angle of 450 with respect to our position in the extreme north of the island. It later took a zig-zag course. During one of its maneuvers it maintained a stationary position. Rapidly with the apparatus at hand (theodolite and long range binoculars), we observed this body in a stationary position for a period of 20 minutes. During this period Corporal Uladislao Duran Martines of our group quickly got his camera and took 10 photographs (more or less) which he believes to be perfect. He not only took the pictures directly but he also took them using the theodolite and the long range binoculars. Unluckily, we must wait until March of the coming year in order to develop these pictures. To corroborate my statement I later communicated with the English base. People from this base said that they had observed an object of star of the first magnitude. This communication was made at 2030 hours. The same thing happened with personnel of the Argentine base Orcad. In this case, we were more certain that we were dealing with a strange solid object because their electro-magnetic equipment showed abnormal interference from the moment during which it appeared.

4. The 18 July edition of La Nacion, Santiago newspaper carried the following:

"On 17 July several people in Colonia, Uruguay observed the landing of a flying saucer on a beach. The report stated that the strange object remained on the beach close to two minutes and then continued silently on a vertical flight toward the River de la Plata where it remained suspended in space for several minutes at an altitude of 10 meters, later continuing in horizontal flight calculated at approximately 500 meters.

"The people who viewed the object stated no troops were observed; that it left an "X" on the beach similar to a retractible mechanical foot and that it was reddish in color and difficult to look at due to its lumonosity.

"A little later strange objects were sighted flying over Buenos Aires. One of the spectators took a photograph of the objects."

5. The 20 July edition of El Mercurio, Diario Illustrado and La Nacion carried accounts of a strange object flying in the vicinity of Antofagasta for a period of approximately 25 minutes.

"On 19 July in the Provinces of Tarapace and Antofagasta, Chile, a strange object was observed flying at a high speed ejecting explosions of great force and very loud. The object was first sighted at 1555 and was described to be in the form of a cone with the point to the rear. It was observed by six laborers at the Maria Elena Nitrate Mine."

6. On 23 July 1965 the Diario Illustrado, Santiago newspaper contained the following:

"On the 20th of July at 0400 in the morning an occupant in a hotel at Chafaral was awakened by a loud noise. He looked out the window and saw an intense red object that had a diameter of approximately 10 to 12 meters land on the sand in the vicinity of the hotel and 4 to 5 minutes thereafter it left with a violent noise and was seen no longer."

Comments of reporting officer: There may be a connection between some of the sightings and the U. S. Space program, e.g. A check with NASA indicates that objects 1965 46D and 1965 46E which were part of the 1965 46A (COSMOS 68) series which was launched on 15 June had a decay date of 19 June 1965,

Sometime during February or Karch 1963, Source witnessed what appeared to be two vertical take-cifs of unidentified flying objects from the center of the Soviet airfield (Installation 5323, EL 0231-C3373) at 512200N-1'5700E (GB 065988) west of MECHURA. The two take-offs occurred within a three day interval and both times at approximately 0200 hours. Since the house from which Source cade his observation was located about two hillwriters from the take-off point, he was unable to recognize or exercise the flying objects. The only positive identification was the exhaust flame, which was bright red and grayish white at the end and the solic which he described as being louder than a normal jet ergine under full power. The object ascended vertically for approximately seven seconds emitting a very low pitch sound and a higher pitched sound after the object leveled off and disappeared in a westerly direction.

(THE TWO 1972 IMPACT AREAS WERE APPROXIMATELY TEN AND DNE-HALF MILES APART. THE APPARENT 1978 IMPACT AREA IS ABOUT FIVE MILES SOUTH OF BOTH, FORHING A TRIANGULAR PATTERN). THE STATISTICAL LIKELIHOOD OF THO SEPARATE SPACECRAFT DECAYING IN A WAY WHICH CAUSED THEM TO IMPACT IN VIRTUALLY THE SAME SPOT ON THE GLOBE WAS CONSIDERED TO BE SO SHALL AS TO MAKE THE 1978 OBJECTS SUSPECT. THIS SUSPICION WAS REINFORCED BY ADVICE FROM MT. JOHN BAKER-NUNN TRACKING STATION THAT THEY HAD NOT BEEN ALERTED TO SPACE CRAFT DECAY DURING THE OCTOBER 23-24 PERIOD. THE WELD BEAD DID NOT PENETRATE THE JOINT, AND A PAIRLY WIDE REACH BETWEEN THE TWO HEMISPHERES IS OBSERVABLE. DBIR WILL CONTINUE TO COOPERATE WITH FULL ANALYSIS INFOR-



At approximately 0033 hours, 24 August 1969, the pilot of a fixedwing, light observation aircraft (OV-10) observed an unidentified object on the ;round approximately five miles north-northeast of Nakhon Phanom RTAFB. At the time, the pilot was searching for unidentified flying objects pursuant to in earlier Base Command Post request made while the OV-10 was on final approach for landing. The aircraft orbitted the sighting area, and the pilot observed that he thought to be a large, omni-directional light on a stretch of read. In his next pass, the pilot sighted 15-25 individuals gathered around a 'lattice structure", which he said could have been a helicopter with its. rotor blades folded. He next observed the object being moved into trees djacent to the road. The pilot vectored the area and pin-pointed the Location as VE 652280. USAF Security Police representatives subsequently idvised that a sweep of the sighting area, from Ban Na Mun Hin (VE 668235) to the vicinity of Ban Ram Rat (VE 641280), by Royal Thai Army (RTA) personnel between 0100 and 0400 hours, 24 August 1969 produced no results, nor did a joint RTA-USAF Security Police search at 1100 hours the same day, (OSI Evaluation re helicopter sighting: F-5).

3. 5106-ASP-6J reported that on the night of 23-24 August 1969, some twenty Thai National residents of Ban Sang Hin (VE 682249) reportedly travelled to and from the Wat Si Sa-at, located in Ban Ram Rat (VE 641280), to make an offering. This religious procession followed the country road to Ban lam Rat, pussing through Ban Nong Bua (VE 668265) and Ban Khok Sawang (VE 557278). On their return trip, between Bun Nong Bua and Ban Sang Hin, members of the group noticed an aircraft circling overhead. One of the villagers, who was carrying a portable electric lantern to light their path, shined his light inpward at the plane. Source (5106-ASP-6J) stated that this incident occurred sometime between 2400 hours 23 August and 0100 hours 24 August 1969. (F-3).

4. In an effort to obtain further details, 5106-ASP-6, supra, travelled to Ban Sang Hin, where he questioned a villager (NFI) who allegedly took part in the pilgrimage to Wat Si Sa-at. This villager confirmed the information received from 5106-ASP-6J, and provided the following additional details:

a. The religious procession left Ban Sang Hin at approximately 2000 hours, 23 August 1969, arrived at the wat two hours later, and departed for home again at 2330 hours. Enroute, the villagers travelled along the country road more or less in a single file. Some carried flushlights to light the way, and at least one villager carried a powerful electric lantern. On the return trip, the pilgrims carried with them two large ceremonial drums. Due to the weight of the drums, they were suspended between two long poles, with several persons supporting each pole. (F-3).

Sang Hin, members of the group observed an aircraft circling overhead, and the villager with the electric lantern directed its beam at the plane. When the plane continued to circle, and began to come lower, some members of the group became frightened and ran into the woods along the road. After the aircraft left the area, the group continued on its way, arriving at Ban Sang Hin between OlOO and Ol3O hours, 24 August 1969. (F-3). (See attached sketch).

COMMENTS OF THE APPROVING OFFICER: The information in paragraphs 3 and 4 above, was furnished the Commander and Director of Intelligence, 56th Special Operations Wing and 56th Security Police Squadron, Nakhon Phanom RTAFB, upon receipt.

While the location of the pilot's sighting and the route ascribed to the religious procession do not coincide precisely, their proximity and the coincidence of timing makes it apparent that the "helicopter with folded



rotor blades" was probably no more that the poles supporting large ceremonial irums. The location pinpointed by the OV-10 pilot is little more than a mile from a line between Ban Nong Bua and Ban Sang Hin, and such an error would not be unreasonable considering the sighting was made from a moving observation point at night. Further, the possibility exists that RTA personnel, searching for the ground object originally reported, may have come across information pointing to the religious procession, but failed to report it.

Radar and visual sightings of UrOs, such as that being checked out by the DV-10 pilot in this instance, are not a new phenomenon, particularly at night. I January 1969 report lists seven UFO sightings at Nakhon Phanom RTAFB for the period 28 November 1968 to 1 January 1969 alone. Attempts by base reconnaissance aircraft to further identify the objects were unsuccessful. Noting these unresolved reports, the 7/13th Air Force Director of Intelligence offered several comments and possible explanations:

- a. On 28 November 1968, the Thai Border Patrol Police (BPP) began an operation involving four to six BPP and Royal Thai Army (RTA) helicopters, in the vicinity of some of the sightings northwest of the base. While Thai pilots had historically been reluctant to fly at night, a recent full moon had made night flying almost as easy as daytime operations, and pilots of both the BPP and RTA had been known to accomplish night flights. Centralized control of these agencies autonomous counter-insurgency operations is weak, however, and Thai units frequently filed flights plans with the Air Defense Surveillance System only after the fact, if at all.
- b. Alternatively, the UFOs sighted might have been aircraft on clandestine flights by US agencies, as such flights are often completed without details being released to traffic control offices. Though it is possible that the illicit flights were friendly, for purposes of privategain, pleasure or smuggling, there was no evidence at the time to substantiate that possibility.
- c. During November and early December, radar gear in Thailand, particularly Ground Controlled Approach (GCA) scopes, have historically yielded large numbers of returns from natural or cultural phenomena, e.g., temperature inversions, balloons from fairs and religious celebrations, migratory birds, and kites. In November 1967, Headquarters 7/13th Air Force conducted an experiment at Udorn RTAFB, where GCA scopes were reporting more than fifteen unidentified returns. In a span of ten minutes, human observers physically sighted scores of balloons, three flocks of migratory birds, several kites, plus at least four local helicopters. These sighting, even of friendly flights, could not be correlated with GCA and other electronic returns.
- d. In analysing the threat of helicopters penetrating Thailand or supporting insurgent forces, a preliminary study of the technical factors involved determined that landing helicopters in remote jungle clearings at night to airlift personnel or materiel was highly dangerous, particularly without sophisticated navigational and landing aids. Additionally, the nearby Communist or neutral countries from which the helicopters might come do not presently possess adequate numbers of low/slow aircraft to support their own field forces, officials or units by air, without considering any high risk extra-territorial missions.
- e. In 1967, unidentified aircraft activity, purportedly in support of Communist insurgents inside Thailand, seemed to preoccupy Thai officials until U.S. resources provided Hawk anti-aircraft missiles. Then, in a speech of acceptance and thanks, General PHRAPHAT, Deputy Prime Minister, said the helicopter threat from outside Thailand had ended or come under control.

It would not seem necessary for incurgents to use helicopters for crossing into Thailand. Evidence indicates that much of the Thai-Laotian border can be crossed at ground level without a great deal of difficulty, affording a 'ar cheaper, safer and less obvious means of infiltration or exfiltration. et That military and police agencies continue to report helicopter sightings, or fail to report conflicting information which might derogate claims of helicopter activity. This phenomenon may reflect the fact that the presence of selicopters would be evidence of "externally supported aggression," and provide an explanation of Thailand's insurgent movement which fortuitously mits any possibility of an internal cause. A recent self-analysis by the That government Communist-suppression agency in mid-South Thailand provides a notably perceptive insight into a facet of That personality which affects additionally the gathering and validity of intelligence information from the field. The report cautions government officials against their prevalent attitude that no report of insurgent activity is sufficiently important to send forward unless it has been bulwarked with references to unidentified support helicopters, transceivers and AK rifles, or the presence of some . famous guerilla leader. 2
