QUESTION: [1985H] To ask the Secretary of State for Defence, who assessed that the events around RAF Woodbridge and RAF Bentwaters in December 1980, which were reported to his Department by Lieutenant Colonel Charles Halt were of no defence significance; on what evidence the assessment was made; what analysis of events was carried out; and if he will make a statement.

QUESTION: [1986H] To ask the Secretary of State for Defence, what response his Department made to the report submitted by Lieutenant Colonel Charles Halt detailing events in Rendlesham Forest in December 1980; what interviews were held; and if he will make a statement.

DRAFT ANSWER: The report was assessed by the staff in my Department responsible for air defence matters. Since the judgement was that it contained nothing of defence significance no further action was taken.

BACKGROUND - PQs 1985H & 1986H



1. Mr Redmond has asked a large number of questions about military aviation issues over the years. He recently tabled four PQs about unidentified flying objects prompted, we believe, by the recent publication of a book on the subject by a former member of Sec(AS). The MP has tabled a further six questions on the subject of "UFOs" for answer before the Parliamentary recess, two of which follow up earlier answers he received about an alleged "UFO" incident which occurred outside RAF Woodbridge in Rendlesham Forest in December 1980 (Hansard extracts attached).
2. The alleged incidents to which Mr Redmond refers occurred between 27-29 December 1980 when unusual lights were seen by USAF personnel, including the Deputy Base Commander, outside RAF Woodbridge. A report of the sighting (copy attached) was forwarded to the MOD by the RAF Liaison Officer at RAF Bentwaters. The report was examined by the Department at the time and no other evidence of any matter of defence significance was found. This is of course the Department's only interest in such sightings.
3. Our line regarding this alleged incident is that all available evidence was examined at the time and we are satisfied that nothing of defence concern occurred in the location on the nights in question. No additional information has come to light over the last 15 years which calls the original judgement into question.
4. The only documents on the subject held by the Department are the report itself, limited official comments on the report, and correspondence from members of the public enquiring about the alleged events. The wording of the draft reply is in line with that used in responses to previous Parliamentary Enquiries on the subject (see attached).
5. There is no requirement for the Department to contact or reply to a witness following receipt of a "UFO" report. It would only have

been necessary to contact Lt Col Halt had there been any indication that the sighting was of defence relevance and it was necessary to interview him further. As this was not the case no response was appropriate or necessary.

HINSON'S HAD ENOUGH

Not only is the FAA losing its top safety administrator, agency chief David R. Hinson is likely to leave before the end of the year. The FAA is looking both inside and outside the agency to replace Anthony Broderick, the associate administrator for regulation and certification. Broderick, a well-respected administrator and safety official who held his job for eight years, was prompted to retire this week in the wake of the agency's bungled oversight of ValuJet. Well before the ValuJet crash and ensuing flap, Hinson had told the White House he did not want to serve in the second term, should President Clinton be re-elected.

DECISION TIME

The decision to ground ValuJet came down to management of maintenance, not dispatch, operations or training by the airline, Hinson told *Aviation Week & Space Technology*. Both ValuJet and the FAA fell down on maintenance oversight, he admitted. "We have regulated the airlines and the repair stations from the top down, but did not previously look adequately at the link between the two." Hinson decided June 16 that the airline could no longer keep up with correcting the faults inspectors were finding. Hinson said he simply briefed Clinton aides on his decision on June 17, but there was never any pressure on the FAA from the White House before or after the decision.

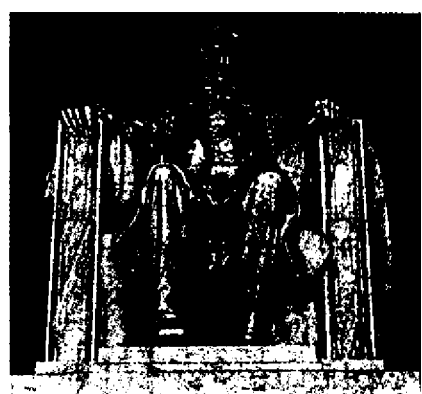
POLITICAL MOTIVATIONS

Rep. Bud Shuster (R.-Pa.), who chairs the House aviation subcommittee, has scheduled hearings this week not only on the FAA's oversight of ValuJet Airlines, but whether its grounding was politically motivated. In an unusual display of bipartisanship, Rep. James Oberstar (D.-Minn.), the ranking minority member of the subcommittee, agrees those hearings are necessary. A long-time critic of the FAA, he also complained that the agency keeps too much safety information too close to its vest.

BROKEN PROMISES

Bob Dole may have embarrassed Lockheed Martin executives during his visit to Sunnyvale, Calif., last week. According to a Lockheed Martin official, Dole's people had pledged he would not use the appearance for "Clinton bashing." But Dole, standing with executives in front of a large company banner, said, "The Administration's hostility to defense has been like a Stinger missile aimed at the heart of the California economy, destroying some 215,000 jobs in this state." California Gov. Pete Wilson (R.) had said earlier that 215,000 jobs were lost *in the last*

10 years. Dole charged Clinton has broken his 1992 campaign promise to maintain a strong military. Instead he drove military expenditures down "to their lowest percent of gross domestic product since the bombing of Pearl Harbor." He blasted Clinton's opposition to the rapid deployment of a national missile defense (NMD) system, charging China threatened to "rain nuclear bombs on Los Angeles" if the U.S. comes to Taiwan's defense. "In my Administration, California will never again be subject to nuclear blackmail," Dole promised, neglecting to mention that initial NMD systems wouldn't be able to fend off massive missile strikes. Meanwhile, the Clinton Administration—coincidentally, no doubt—announced the day before Dole's visit that Lockheed Martin was one of two finalists for a multi-billion-dollar contract to build the JASSM missile (see p. 29).



FIGHTER ATTACK

The General Accounting Office's criticism of the F/A-18E/F is finally public after months of congressional review. The GAO says the Pentagon could save "almost \$17 billion" if it would abandon the \$89-billion, 1,000-aircraft F/A-18E/F program and instead buy additional F/A-18C/Ds until the lower-cost Joint Strike Fighter goes into production. The GAO says operational deficiencies used to justify the E/Fs either have not materialized or could be corrected with changes to the C/Ds. It says E/F range increases were achieved at the expense of combat performance, and wind tunnel tests suggest there may be problems in using its full weapons payload. Some congressional staffers said the GAO report was flawed. However, they do see a big "tac-air funding crunch" coming, with neither the F/A-18E/F nor the F-22 being built in today's numbers. Only about 200-300 Lockheed Martin F-22s will be built, not the 442 currently projected, staffers predicted. With the latest cost projection of \$100 million per aircraft in full-rate production, there will be no way the Air Force can afford them all, no matter who wins the election. Staffers expect the number of Air Force and Navy wings won't decrease, but that the aircraft in a squadron will continue to shrink to as few as 10 or 12 from a high of 24.

ALIEN TO OUR THINKING

The Air Force has been officially queried by USA Today on its contingency plans if the U.S. is invaded by aliens from space. The inquiry apparently was triggered by the new movie "Independence Day." An Air Force official said that the service would forego any extensive planning pending verification of the existence of aliens.

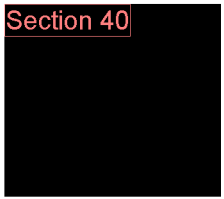

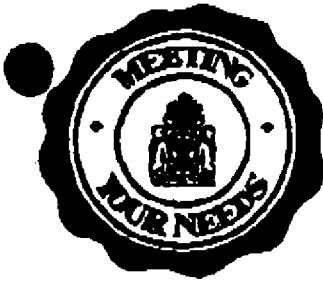

NICK POPE - RECENT MEDIA APPEARANCE AND STATEMENTS IN EXTRACTS FROM HIS BOOK

1. Thank you for your D/DI55/108/15 of 24 June concerning Nick Pope's continued activities in promoting his book, which you may have noted has featured in the Sunday Times bestseller list (albeit in the "general" section - "fiction" might have been a more appropriate categorisation). I fear that you are in danger of falling for Mr Pope's exaggerated description of his rôle whilst in Sec(AS)2a.
2. I can assure you that there has been no change whatsoever in our policy on UFO matters. We are not aware of any scientific investigations into UFO sightings, nor of any "threat to the Realm". If there were such investigations or evidence of a threat we would expect to hear of them from you rather than vice versa.
3. Turning to your concerns about disclosures about DI55, I explained in my minute of 1 May that to date Mr Pope had been very careful over this matter. I have no reason to believe that he has any intention on making such disclosures in future, but there is always a small risk that he might say something unwise in an unguarded moment.
4. The nearest he has possibly come to any disclosure in the material we have seen is the attached extract from "The X-Files Book of the Unexplained" by Jane Goldman, published by Simon & Schuster (Mr Pope's publisher). This "X-files" spinoff contains a chapter about Mr Pope entitled "The Real X-Files". In the sidelined paragraph from that chapter he refers to a "Deep Throat character" who we thought might be you - certainly Mr Pope gave us to understand, whilst he worked here, that he had found a kindred spirit in you. Alternatively, the reference could be to his father who was, at the time Mr Pope was in Sec(AS)2a, Deputy Chief Scientific Adviser.
5. Should you have any continuing concerns about Mr Pope's future activities they are best taken up with his current line management in GF Pol.

Pope is aware that some of his allegations can sound suggestive. For instance, there were times when he was, he suspects, 'deliberately given other work just to take me off an investigation.' He asserts: 'I know some people say that's because they were covering something up. But honestly they did not know about flying saucers. If they were covering up anything it was their own ignorance and prejudice about the subject.'

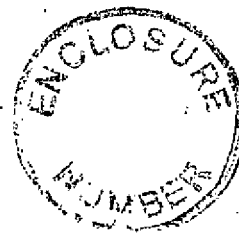
However, Pope's experiences were not without a touch of X-Files-style intrigue. He reluctantly confesses: 'I don't really want to get into this, but I had a sort of Deep Throat. Not necessarily someone directly involved, but yeah, I had a Deep Throat character. A sympathiser who I would sometimes consult, who would offer an opinion. Someone in a senior position? I don't think I can really get into that, but I think you could say: well-placed to discuss one or two of the more interesting options.'

After the military style, the M.o.D. regularly appoints its employees to new tours of duty, and in the summer of 1994, Pope was promoted to a position in a financial department. 'An awful lot of people were glad to see the back of me, I can tell you,' he laughs. 'I had mixed feelings. Unless there is evidence to indicate that the UK Air Defence Region may have been compromised, and to date no sighting has provided such evidence, my Department does not investigate or seek to provide an explanation for what was observed. The question of unexplainable sightings has not therefore arisen.

BACKGROUND - PQs 1755H & 1767H

1. These PQs follow two recent PQs tabled by Mr Redmond about an alleged "unidentified flying object" incident which occurred outside RAF Woodbridge in Rendlesham Forest in December 1980. It is not clear why Mr Redmond has become interested in unidentified flying objects. There has been an increase in media attention on the subject of "UFOs" of late, partially as a result of the recent publication of a book on the subject by a former member of Sec(AS), and this may account for his interest.

2. There are commonly held misconceptions surrounding the MOD's role and responsibilities with respect to "unexplained" aerial phenomena. The Department has a very limited interest - our only concern is to establish whether there is any evidence of a matter which is of defence significance.

3. One of the functions of Sec(AS)2a is to act as the MOD focal point for reports and correspondence relating to "UFO" sightings. The task falls to Sec(AS) because the official interest in "UFO sightings" is an air defence one: is there any evidence in a sighting of a breach of UK air defences? Our role in relation to reports is therefore to examine them, with the assistance of the appropriate experts, as required, to ascertain whether the sighting represents anything of defence interest. If we judge that it does not, and this has been the case in respect of all "UFO" sightings reported to the MOD to date, we do not seek to investigate further or to provide an explanation of what might have been seen. There are no MOD staff who work on this subject full-time, and the work represents a small part of the overall secretariat function performed by Sec(AS)2a. Unfortunately, however, Sec(AS)2a is often erroneously referred to by the media as the MOD's "UFO" office.

4. Since we do not seek to establish the precise nature of each sighting reported to us by implication it is quite normal for a sighting to remain "unexplained" but not require further official

action. We are therefore unable to provide the details requested in Mr Redmond's question (PQ 1767H). We have chosen instead to clarify our official role in relation to "UFO" sightings. The draft answer follows the wording used in a previous PQ answer on the subject (House of Lords, Official Report, 7 Dec 94 WA 90) (attached).

BACKGROUND - 1492H

1. This PQ is a follow on to PQ 1220H (Official Report 7 May 96 columns 19-20 attached), which sought the classification of the documents held by the MOD in respect of the alleged events at Rendlesham Forest in December 1980.
2. Mr Redmond has asked a large number of PQs on military low flying over the years and it is our understanding that he tables many of these questions on behalf of Section 40, a researcher into low flying and other military aviation issues, rather than as a result of any direct personal interest. It is not clear why Mr Redmond is specifically interested in the alleged events at Rendlesham Forest, but it is a subject which continues to fascinate "UFO" enthusiasts, and is a topic about which Sec(AS) continues to receive regular correspondence.
3. The alleged incidents occurred between 27-29 December 1980 when unusual lights were seen by USAF personnel, including the Deputy Base Commander, outside RAF Woodbridge. A report of the sighting (copy attached) was forwarded to the MOD by the RAF Liaison Officer at RAF Bentwaters. The report was examined by the Department at the time and no other evidence of any matter of defence significance was found. This is of course the Department's only interest in such sightings.
4. Our line regarding this alleged incident is that all available evidence was examined at the time and we are satisfied that nothing of defence concern occurred in the location on the nights in question. No additional information has come to light over the last 15 years which calls the original judgement into question.
5. The only documents on the subject held by the Department are the report itself, limited official comments on the report, and correspondence from members of the public enquiring about the alleged events.



1. Thank you for your letter at Reference which asked for information concerning a the alleged sighting of an Unidentified Aerial Phenomena (UAP) being chased by a Hercules, presumably from RAF Lyneham.

2. We only had one Hercules low-flying that night. I have interviewed the Captain, Flt Lt **Section 40**, and he remembers the evening clearly but not because of any UAP. The evening ended with a "maldrop" at Keevil airfield, near Westbury, whilst he was attempting an Ultra Low-Level Airdrop at a height of 10 ft (yes TEN) wearing Night Vision Goggles. Most of us would remember an emergency on such a high technical merit exercise.

3. Flt Lt **Section 40** flew fly low-level in Wales but states that he never flew above 52°30'N (a line roughly through the middle of Birmingham). Therefore, he was not in the vicinity of the M50 (but, then again, it was dark!). Moreover, he states that he neither saw a UAP, or gave chase. Perhaps the photographic evidence will yield some clues.

4. Sorry we couldn't not be of more help. I am also pleased to know that you not on drugs, etc; however, the concept of alien women poses some interesting thoughts!

At SOUTH DRIVE I stopped the car to watch a "LIGHT FORMATION" which I had been following for several minutes.

The OBJECT or LIGHT FORMATION appeared moving slowly from the ANNIESLAND direction and was constant in height estimated at between 200 - 400 FEET ABOVE GROUND LEVEL.

Whilst stationary, in SOUTH DRIVE, I had an extremely clear view of the FORMATION then it came to a standstill very close to VICTORIA PARK. It was in the form of a CHRISTMAS TREE at a height of APPROX. 200-300 FT AGL and remained there for between one and two minutes

I then observed another smaller object appear from ground level relative to where I was standing.

This object rose from behind some buildings that lay in my view and was of a definite triangular shape small in size. It had low power white lights also triangular within the defined shape of the object.

It then moved vertically from the ground and travelled horizontally a very short distance estimated as 100 yards and proceeded to merge into one of the corners of the LIGHT FORMATION and was then no longer visible when the three light extinguished.

The LIGHT FORMATION remained stationary throughout this event then disappeared like a light bulb being switched off within 15-30 seconds. No distinctive shape of the secondary object could be observed within the primary formation after the object merged.

On site examination by myself and a fellow investigator has revealed the possible location where the small object arose and might be one of two locations, either the YARROW SHIPYARD or immediately opposite over the RIVER CLYDE BARR & STROUD ELECTRONICS.

No sound was emitted at any stage throughout the sighting and was definitely not an aircraft, helicopter or balloon.
