Background

A Redacted version of the Rendlesham file was placed on the MoD website for public viewing before being removed in late 2007/early 2008 for copyright reasons. The applicant is referring to this.

The Rendlesham file was released on 4 occasions to date in 2009 and is one of the next batch of files due to be released to The National Archives later this year.

The information on the Rendlesham file is non contentious. However, such is the fame of this incident and public interest in the case, that a great many names of individuals involved are now already in the public domain and it makes little sense to withhold them unnecessarily. It would also open the MoD up to possible censure and ridicule. Therefore, a number of names and addresses have not been withheld. This is consistent with previous releases of the file and that intended for publication. Redactions have already been agreed with DG Info.

This would account for the non sequential enclosure numbering. Although the file cover states the file was opened on 25 October 1982, it is clear that this was not the case. Sec(AS) was not in being at this time, only being formed in early 1985 and therefore no file with a reference number commencing with D/Sec(AS) could have been in existence in 1982. No record of when the file was created can be found.



Thank you for your e-mail of 24 March 2009 asking how you can obtain the Ministry of Defence (MoD) documents on the Rendlesham Forest Incident of 1980. Your e-mail is being treated as a formal request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Providing you with all documentation the MoD holds on the Rendlesham incident would involve manually checking, as a minimum, some 100 UFO files, and then preparing relevant documents for release, the cost of which would exceed far the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

However, the MoD has a file on this incident, that was created sometime after the incident and which is currently being prepared for release to The National Archives as part of a programme to transfer some 160 MOD files on UFO matters. The MoD had previously placed the file on its own website, but has had to remove this for copyright reasons. If you would like a copy of our file on Rendlesham, please let me know whether you prefer a PDF copy on disk (our preferred option as it saves on paper and postage costs) or a hard copy, together with your address and I will forward it to you. I am afraid that due to the size of the file, I am unable to e-mail it to you.

You may wish to be aware that the MOD has already released a great deal of

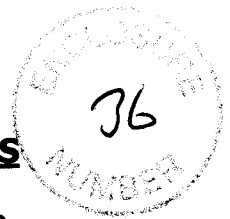

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 9 April 2009 asking for details of UFO sightings for 2008.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

Details of UFO sightings for 2008 are on the MoD website, however, as you do not have a computer, I have printed off the details for you and have included details of sightings logged on our database for 2009 to date.

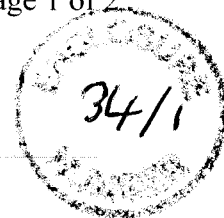

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 6 April 2009 asking for information regarding UFOs in Birmingham and the rest of the country over the last year.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

Details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for the period 1997-2008 can be found by searching under UFO Reports on the MoD website at www.mod.uk. I attach a spreadsheet showing details of UFO sightings recorded by the MoD to date for 2009. You will note a few reports for 2008 that were not received in time to be placed on the MoD website. Additionally, in a number of cases, no firm date was given for the sighting and only the month is given.

I hope this is helpful.

You have not given a timeframe for the number of sightings in Edinburgh and Scotland, but details of UFO sightings reported to the MoD for the period 1997-2008 can be found on the Ministry of Defence (MoD) website www.mod.uk by searching under the phrase "*UFO Reports*". To date this year, there have been two sightings near Edinburgh and nine in the rest of Scotland.

The MoD, which has the lead across government in dealing with UFO matters, employs one full time civil servant (myself) dedicated to dealing with the subject of UFOs. The post is at D Grade, which is the most junior management level within the Ministry. Whilst it would be inappropriate to provide individual salary details, the pay range for D grade posts is £20,815-£27,159 per year.

In addition to my post, I receive some administrative support from an E1 Grade civil servant and my civil service line manager at C1 grade has oversight of my work. Approximately 20% of the E1's and C1's time is spent on UFO related matters. The annual pay range for an E1 is £15,847-£20,074 and for the C1 it is £32,623-£41,325. All three posts attract a standard local recruitment and retention allowance for RAF High Wycombe of £2000 per year. As a rough guide therefore, based on the highest annual salary, total costs are in the order of £40,000 per year.

In the majority of cases, the procedure for dealing with UFO reports is to record the details of the sighting and to write to the individual concerned, explaining the limited involvement of the MoD in UFO matters. At the beginning of each year we place details of the preceding year's sightings on the MoD website.

On occasion we do investigate reports. This usually involves liaising with air defence experts (such as radar specialists) on, perhaps, half a dozen reports per year. These will generally be sightings made by aircrew, members of the armed forces or the police. However, to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

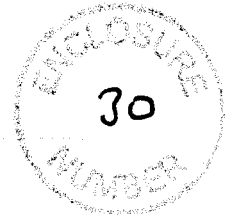

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 24 March 2009 asking how many UFO reports the Ministry of Defence received for 2007-2009 and for any other information on UFOs.

Firstly, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

Despite a great many rumours, the MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

Details of sightings received by the MoD for the period 1997-2008 are available on the MoD website www.mod.uk by searching under "*UFO Reports*". I attach details of UFO sightings for 2009 to date. You will note that in a number of instances we do not have an exact date for the sighting. Also we received a handful of sightings for 2008 after we had placed the figures for that year on our website.

You may wish to be aware that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed after five years until 1967 when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1992 are now available for public viewing. The National Archives can be contacted at Ruskin Avenue, Richmond, Kew, Surrey TW9 4DU or telephone, 020 8876 3444. The National Archives also have a website giving information about the records they hold and how to access them. This can be found on the internet at www.nationalarchives.gov.uk.

The National Archives makes a small charge for people to view these files, but they placed seven new files on their website this week and for a short period of time they are available for viewing at no charge. The Ministry of Defence Freedom of Information website also contains some released information on UFOs. This can be accessed the internet at www.mod.uk by searching under "*UFO*".

I hope this is helpful and good luck with your project.

A copy of the official case file for the Cosford Incident. I understand that the documents were withdrawn from the MoD website for copyright reasons.

Background

Alongside the Rendlesham Incident, the Cosford Incident is probably the most famous UFO incident in the UK. A number of redacted documents relating to the Cosford incident were placed on the MoD website for public viewing before being removed in late 2007/early 2008 for copyright reasons. These documents comprised the bulk of the documents on the MoD file but the file itself was not released. Whilst confusing the two, the applicant has clearly asked for the file. There is no reason why the applicant cannot be provided with the documents that previously appeared on the website. However, the residual documents, which together with those published already form the Cosford file, should be withheld under exemption s.22 as it is one of the batch of files due for transfer to The National Archives later this year.

The Cosford file itself was withheld on 2 occasions in 2008 under exemption s.22 but the documentation previously on the website was released 7 times in 2008.

The information on the Cosford file is largely non contentious but two documents, already in the public domain following earlier FOI requests, can be misinterpreted as an admission that the MoD believed an alien craft penetrated UK airspace. In fact, the MoD concern was centred on the alleged Aurora aircraft. All redactions on the file and those on the documents previously placed on the website are made under exemption s.40 and have already been agreed with CMem.

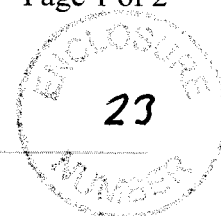

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 23 February 2009 asking for copies of any and all documentation regarding the alleged UFO incident at Rendlesham Forrest in 1980. The other aspects of your request will be dealt with by another branch.

Answering your request would involve manually checking, as a minimum, some 100 UFO files, and then preparing relevant documents for release, the cost of which would exceed far the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

Details of sightings for 2009 will be added in January 2010. I attach details of UFO sightings for 2009 to date. In a number of cases we do not have the actual date of the sighting. You will also note a small number of reports covering 2008. These were received after the bulk of the 2008 reports were placed on the website.

You may also wish to be aware that the Ministry of Defence (MoD) has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MoD files were routinely destroyed after five years until 1967 when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1992 are now available for public viewing. A major programme to transfer UFO files from the Directorate of Air Staff and Defence Intelligence Staff covering the period up to 2007, is currently underway and it is hoped this will be completed by the end of 2010. Thank you for your e-mail of 25 January 2009 asking how the MoD investigates UFO reports and whether the MoD has to investigate over extended periods of time.

The MoD examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural

phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

That having been said, we do occasionally investigate sightings reported to the MoD. This usually involves liaising with air defence specialists (e.g. radar experts) on perhaps half a dozen sightings per year. These will generally be sightings made by aircrew, members of the armed forces or the police. Each case is viewed on an individual basis and it is not possible to predict how long an investigation would take or what course it would follow. However, I can say that investigations are limited in their nature and likely to be concluded within weeks, rather than months. I am not aware of any investigation in recent years lasting for more than a few weeks.

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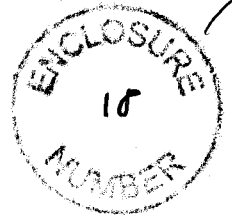

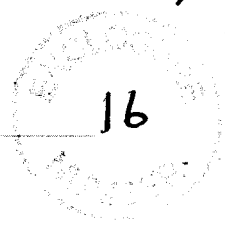

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 1 February 2009 asking whether there was any activity taking place over the Rhiw on the Lleyn Peninsula 31 January 2009 as several witnesses saw an unexplained light.

The Ministry of Defence does not keep a central record of all military aircraft activity and in order to accurately state whether there was any military flying activity in the area, we would need to contact some thirty flying stations across the UK, the cost which would exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

Whilst we do have a centralised record of aircraft entering the UK Low Flying System, this system was closed on the day in question and I would therefore very much doubt that the sightings were caused by military aircraft.

No other similar sightings were made for the areas in question over this period.

You wished to know if there was any military activity in these areas at the time of the sightings and whether we had received any similar reports. Please take this response to cover both requests.

The Ministry of Defence does not keep a central record of all military aircraft activity and in order to accurately state whether there was any military activity in the area, we would need to contact some thirty flying stations across the UK, the cost which would exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the Ministry of Defence is not obliged to comply with your request.

Whilst we do have a centralised record of aircraft entering the UK Low Flying System, this system was closed over the period in question and I would therefore very much doubt that the sightings were caused by military activity.

No other similar sightings were made for the areas in question over this period.

I am sorry I can not be more helpful.

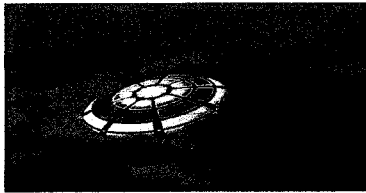

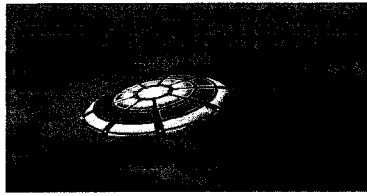

Thank you for your Freedom of Information (FOI) request dated 15 January 2009 asking for documentation regarding Flying Triangle sightings between 2006-08, UFO incidents at RAF Cosford, RAF Shawbury and Cornwall in 1993, in Belgium in 1989, over the Channel Islands in April 2007 and an incident involving an Air France flight from Nice to London in 1994.

Additionally, you wrote to Air Marshal Moran regarding the incidents at RAF Cosford, RAF Shawbury and Cornwall in 1993, Manchester in 1995 and a number of incidents in the USA. Since January 2009 this branch has lead responsibility for UFO matters within the Ministry of Defence (MoD) following a reorganisation of work and your letter has been passed to us to answer alongside your FOI request.

Details of UFO sightings for the period 2006-2008, which would include any Flying Triangles are now available for viewing on the MoD website www.mod.uk by searching under the phrase *UFO Reports*.

The information regarding the RAF Cosford, RAF Shawbury and Cornwall incidents is contained in a MoD file covering the sightings in late March 1993. This file was previously available on the MoD website but was removed for copyright reasons (it is possible you may already have seen it on the internet). If you will let me know whether you require a paper copy or an electronic version (our preferred option), I will arrange for it to be sent to you.

UFO files covering the period 1967-1992 have been passed to The National Archives and are available for public viewing on their website www.nationalarchives.gov.uk. Information relating to the Belgian incident may be found in the files available there. However, I am also aware that some later correspondence relating to this matter is also contained in files due for transfer to The National Archives later this year. These files will cover the period

1992 to 2000 and will therefore also include any information we may have on the Air France incident in 1994 and the British Airways incident near Manchester 1995.

Therefore, as provided by exemption s.22 (Information intended for future publication) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the MoD is not obliged to comply with this part of your request.

This is not the end of the matter, of course; section 22 is a qualified exemption, meaning that the MOD must assess the balance of public interest in release of the information.

Whilst there is undoubtedly public interest in this file being released to the public as it will enable them to have a more informed view of the MoD's role in this incident, there is no overriding reason why the public should have the information immediately. Indeed it could be argued, that by releasing files in chronological order, the public will be able to follow the role of the MoD in a more logical and orderly fashion, and to view actions in their correct historical perspective.

It is part of effective administration of government that the publication of information is planned and managed within the department responsible. The release of this file will undermine this release process, and delay the release of other files (which other members of the public may be waiting for) as work on them would necessarily have to be put off.

Finally, the release programme itself is complicated and the release of files out of sequence will result in unnecessary confusion for the MoD, The National Archives and, indeed, the public when they are attempting to track files once they are transferred.

It is for these reasons that we do not believe it would be in the public interest to release these files at this moment

Turning to the incident over the Channel Islands, the limited documentation we hold on the matter can be viewed on the MoD website www.mod.uk by searching in our Disclosure Log under the phrase *Channel Islands*.

I am not aware of the MoD holding any information relating to the incidents in the USA that you mention. First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MOD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters to the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MOD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

With regard to your three observations, I can confirm that for the 12 July 2008, we received four other UFO sighting reports, and they were from Surrey, Gloucestershire, Lincolnshire and North Yorkshire. 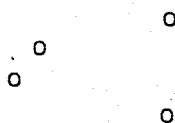
My name is [REDACTED] I am 19 and in Kendal. I have seen these orange lights in the sky on two occasions (see below) since Friday, and I can say with absolute certainty that these are not satellites, space debris or the ISS.

The first sighting was looking west of Kendal at around 11pm on Friday night. Quite low was a bright red/orange light which I assumed was a light of a communications antenna but then realised there aren't any in that area so I stopped and watched it. I then thought it must be a red flare, but a few seconds later a bright, phosphorus white light fell from the orange one, and drifted slowly towards the ground before disappearing. As soon as the white light disappeared the red one slowly faded out. The red light was completely static throughout the 10-15 second sighting.

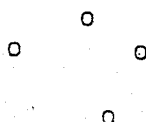
This sighting was not enough to make me want to email the Gazette, as I thought there must be a logical explanation for it. However last night my girlfriend came running into the house, in Kendal, and told me and my brother to come outside (at around 11.15pm). She said she had just seen an orange star move from it's place in the sky, dart across in a straight line and then do a NINETY DEGREES TURN before stopping. How many satellites can do this? We stared at it, and realised there were 3 other dim orange lights, and they were constantly moving in a formation, as if they were trying to find the correct position. They came very close together, then very far apart, the one on the left went from the top of the triangle (the shape they had formed) to the bottom within 2 or 3 seconds. The lights finally settled in an arrow shape, ie:



We watched for half an hour, but they weren't moving very much after that, but we noticed a new dimmer light above and to the right of the left light.



This new dimmer one moved alot, and the bottom right one started moving more too.

Our necks were hurting and we'd been staring for half an hour so we went outside, as they didn't seem to be moving any more. I went back out 5 minutes later to check up and they'd formed like this

This is not an exaggeration, and I wouldn't have e-mailed if I didn't see this for such a long period last night. I hope with all the reports you are getting you can let me know if anyone else saw either of the sightings, so I don't think I'm going insane! The fact that my girlfriend saw a light do a right-angle turn proves [REDACTED] can't dismiss these sightings as space shuttles or satellites.





I am writing with reference to your report of an 'unidentified flying object', seen in June 2008, the details of which you left on our answerphone. This office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MOD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters to the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MOD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

With regard to your particular observation, I can confirm that we received no other reports of 'UFO' sightings for Shirley, West Midlands in June 2008. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised aircraft.

Sorry I could not be any help.

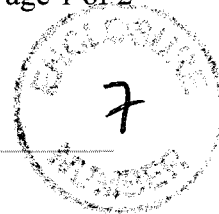

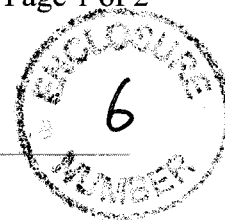

Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 19 January 2009 asking for copies of photographs of UFOs that are either particularly interesting to the Ministry of Defence (MoD) or cannot be explained.

The MoD has UFO files dating back to the early 1990s. We do not hold separate files for UFO photographs, which, if retained, are filed on our standard paper files in date order. To provide you with the information you have requested, we would need to manually search over 120 files, the cost of which would far exceed the £600 limit set for compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and, as provided by Section 12 of the Act, the MoD is not obliged to comply with your request. However, if you could narrow the parameters of your request, perhaps to a couple of years, we may be able to assist you.

The Ministry of Defence examines any reports of 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have some defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspace might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorized foreign military activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external military source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so. We do not therefore, routinely attempt to identify or explain objects seen in UFO photographs forwarded to us, hence the photographs are not categorised in any way. Our sole concern is to satisfy ourselves that the photographs are not of defence significance.

You may be interested to know that the MOD has already released a great deal of information about UFOs which is available for public viewing. MOD files were routinely destroyed after five years until 1967 when they were generally preserved for The National Archives. A few have survived before 1967 and these together with records up to 1992 are now available for public viewing. The National Archives can be contacted at Ruskin Avenue, Richmond, Kew, Surrey TW9 4DU or telephone, 020 8876 3444. The National Archives also have a website giving information about the records they hold and how to access them. This can be found on the internet at: <http://www.nationalarchives.gov.uk>.

You may also be interested to know that the MoD is engaged in a three year programme to transfer UFO files covering the period 1997-2007 to The National Archives. Files will be transferred in chronological order with those covering 1992-2000 transferred in 2009 and those covering 2001-2007 in 2010.

I am a certified UFO Field Investigator for MUFON (Mutual UFO Network) and am currently investigating a possible UFO sighting which happened on 19th June 2008 at 2.10am BST over Kilmarnock, Scotland. The object witnessed was an orange oval shape with 5 smaller star-like objects attached and were also orange. The witness says the object hovered and remained still for 5-10 minutes before accelerating off at tremendous speed eastward and disappeared in a flash. Due to this, the witness is sure it was not a helicopter.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no UFO report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MoD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

I can confirm that we have received no other reports of UFO sightings so far from the Carlisle area for Christmas Day. As regards your question as to whether the lights could have been Meteorological Office equipment, I am afraid I do not hold such information. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MoD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters or the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MoD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

With regard to your particular observation, I can confirm that we have received no other reports of UFO sightings so far from Brightlingsea k this year. However, I will check whether military air defence staff are aware of any relevant unusual occurrence and will let you know accordingly.

This was not reported to Police per say but I thought I ought to let you know as I saw it.

I have been a serving Police Officer for a number of years now and my Partner Karl Norman who was with me at the time is an ex serviceman in the RAF.

I was at my friends address in Brightlingsea, Essex on New Years Eve seeing in the New Year, just before midnight my self and my partner were in the back garden having a cigarette; I could hear fireworks in the distance so looked up to see if I could see them. In the sky was a bright orange/yellow light at first glance I ignored it thinking it was a trailing firework but then double took as it did not disappear. My immediate thought

we were near water and perhaps that could explain the light but it still did not disappear, it moved very slowly in like a half circle around the top of us then stopped over the water between Brightlingsea and East Mersea. It stayed perfectly still for about 3-4 minutes then appeared to shoot straight up in the air very fast, going completely out of view in less than 30 seconds, I must be honest I stood there a bit in awe and missed the start of the new year because of it.
