Major Coldberg was recommended for an appointment as a commissioned officer in the Army of the United States by the Director of Strategic Services, and was appointed Captain and entered on active duty on May 20, 1943. His appointment was desireable at that time in order that it would be possible for him to perform an assignment of vital importance in the Secret Intelligence Branch of this organization. / His assignment at that time was to organize an Intelligence Unit for the purpose of maintaining contact with labor groups and organizations in enemy and enemy occupied countries in Europe. The assignment then contemplated has been accomplished completely and in a superior manner.

3. In the future, it is desired that Major Goldberg perform other assignments of an Intelligence nature which will require his being sent to neutral countries such as Portugal, Sweden, and Switzerland for activities involving Major Goldberg's special knowledge of the European labor movement and intelligence contacts that pertain thereto.

4. Therefore, in view of Major Goldberg's specialized knowledge of this subject, and in view of the fact that his entry into the neutral countries of Europe can better be facilitated by his being in a civilian " status, it is requested that Major Goldberg be relieved from active duty.



Major Arthur J. Goldberg, 0-924384, was first employed by the Office of Strategic Services as a civilian on May 1, 1942, and has continuously been attached to the office both as a civilian and as an officer in the AUS since that date.

As a civilian he was a special assistant to the Director of Strategic Services.

He was requested to assume this position by the Director for the purpose of organizing and supervising a section in the Secret Intelligence Branch of OSS. This section was created in order to maintain contact with labor groups and organizations in enemy occupied and enemy countries. Since these groups were regarded as actual or potential resistance elements to the enemy, it was believed that by recruiting a special section in OSS, staffed with men possessing specialized knowledge of the nature and organization of these labor groups, a valuable contribution could be made to the Intelligence requirements of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and the armies operating under the allied command. Major Goldberg proceeded to establish this section and to recruit both staff and agent personnel required for this purpose.

In connection with his duties in this behalf he was dispatched overseas in the fall of 1942 where he remained for approximately three (3) months.


It became apparent to the Director that in order for Major Goldberg to perform his duties effectively it would be necessary that he be commissioned in the AUS, since the establishment and operation in the section necessitated military status because of constant contacts with military and naval personnel of our own and allied governments. Consequently, the Director, in May of 1943, sponsored his application for a commission in the AUS and he was thereupon duly commissioned a Captain in the Army of the United States. He entered active duty on May 20, 1943, and has been on active duty since then.

On December 13, 1943, Major Goldbergh was promoted to his present rank.

His performance as an officer since assuming active duty has been rated as Superior.

Since being commissioned an officer in the AUS, Major Goldberg has made two trips overseas; in the first of these was from the latter part of August, 1943, to the middle of November, 1943. In the course of this mission, Major Goldberg served on temporary duty in the North African Theater, European Theater, and the Middle East. In Major Goldberg/'s second mission overseas, which was from the latter part of April, 1944, to approximately the first of September, 1944, Major Goldberg served on temporary duty in Italy, North Africa, England, and France.

During the period of his service on active duty as an officer in the AUS, Major Goldberg completed the organization of his section of the Secret Intelligence Branch and the units of his section afe performing effective and valuable work in the various European Theaters. The task of organizing and staffing his section has now been completed and the units of the section so organized by Major Goldberg now function under the direction of the Strategic Services officers for the respective areas. Major Goldberg's essential task for which he was first engaged by the OSS is now complete except that his services will be required from time to time by the Director as a civilian for the reasons hereinafter set forth. From time to time, but not continuously, the Director will require Major Goldberg, as a civilian, to perform certain missions on his behalf which may require his being



sent to neutral countries such as Portugal, Sweden, and Switzerland for secret intelligence activities involving Major Goldberg's special knowledge and skill of the European labor movement and intelligence contacts that pertain thereto. The Director, in view of these facts, requests Major Goldberg be placed on inactive status so that he can thereupon assume his former status as a civilian employee of OSS, available to perform the missions which the Director may from time to time have in contemplation for him.
