This is the final response to your enclosed Freedom of Information Act request dated February 27, 2017, a copy of which is attached for your convenience. We received your request on February 28, 2017, and assigned it case number 17-F-0622. In working with our office you revised your request on March 7, 2017, a copy of the revision is attached for your convenience. We ask that you use this number when referring to your request.

Please note that the responsibility for the SF-311 moved from the Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence to the Pentagon Force Protection Agency during the time frame specified. Please further note how the SF-311 is reported to the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has changed during that time as well. The Military Departments and various DoD Components now reports their own numbers to NARA.

The Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence (USDI) and the Pentagon Force Protection Agency (PFPA), conducted searches of their records systems and located 32 pages, determined to be responsive to your request. Ms. Jacqueline C. Yost, Division Director, Corporate Communications Office, PFPA, an Initial Denial Authority for PFPA and Ms. Carrie L. Wibben, Director, Counterintelligence and Security, an Initial Denial Authority for USDI, have determined that the information which has been redacted from the enclosed 32 pages has been withheld pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6), which applies to information that, if released, would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties.

In this instance, fees for processing your request were below the threshold for requiring payment. Please note that fees may be assessed on future requests.

## OVERVIEW OF FY2013 DOD SF311 REPORT AND ANALYSIS

- The number of *Original Classification Authorities* (OCA) decreased by 6.5% (from 489 in FY2012 to 459 in FY2013).
  - We will continue to ask Components to eliminate positions that do not have a demonstrable and continuing need to exercise OCA authority in accordance with Executive Order 13526.
- The number of *Original Classification Decisions* decreased from 19,121 in FY2012 to 16,424 in FY2013.
  - We assess this decrease as being partially attributable to the missing data from USPACOM and USCYBERCOM, (we will forward their data to ISOO upon receipt). However, it may also be an anomaly of the measurement process itself.
- The number of *Derivative Classification Decisions* decreased by 62% (from 42,271,353 in FY2012 to 25,975,950 in FY2013).
  - Again, we assess this decrease as being partially attributable to the missing data from USPACOM and USCYBERCOM. However, it may also be an anomaly of the measurement process itself.
- The total number of *Pages Declassified decreased* approximately 67% (from 8,082,829 in FY2012 to 4,840,056 in FY2013).
  - These figures will likely change upon receipt of data from USPACOM and USCYBERCOM. However, the largest declassification programs are in the MILDEPS, whose response were sent directly to ISOO.
